Now & Then in Ripon ... Looking back with the Ripon Historical Society

Betty's Floral Service offered flowers for valentines

On Valentine's Day, people often think of giving flowers to loved ones.

Today the Ripon Historical Society looks back to the 1950s and Betty's Floral Service. Betty's Floral Service was owned by Elizabeth "Betty" Christison Rasmussen (1910-2002) and Earl Rasmussen (1915-2002).

Earl served in the U.S. Army from 1942-45 and when he returned from World War II he worked at Kraemer's Florist in Neenah, Wis. Betty grew up in Ripon, graduated from Ripon High School in 1927 and Ripon College in 1931.

The Rasmussens married in 1950 and started Bettv's Floral Service in Betty's childhood home at 626 Lincoln St. Their floral shop is listed in the Ripon telephone directory between 1950 and 1956.

The Ripon Weekly Press from Aug. 23, 1915 noted that Betty's Floral Service was not the first horticultural type business at the house on Lincoln Street.

The article states that Christison (1866-1936), grew flowers on the property and sold them mainly on a wholesale level.

Ripon's Pedrick Genealogy Notebooks noted that as well as growing flowers, Christison had a small truck farm and "engaged in the milk business."
