Schultz Variety Store once occupied Knuth's new home

Earlier this year, Knuth's Brewpub and Event Space opened in a new location at 230 Watson St. However, many people remember back to school shopping in this location when it was the Schultz Variety Store.

The Schultz Variety Store opened in Ripon in 1950 at what then was 232 Watson St.

In 1902, two brothers started The Schultz Brothers Co. with a store in Appleton. The company grew into a chain of 76 variety stores located in Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota and Wisconsin. The majority of these stores were located in Wisconsin.

The Schultz Variety Store not only found a home in Ripon, it expanded. It eventually took over the other half of the building built in 1904 at the corner of Watson and Blossom Streets. In 1965, Schultz Brothers also expanded the building from 75-feet deep to 110-feet deep after working with the city by changing the alley behind the building.

The Schultz Variety Stores were known as "5 and 10" stores, sometimes called a "five and dime." They carried all kinds of general merchandise, including clothing, toys, household items, bedding, sporting goods and much more.

The Ripon Schultz Brothers location closed in approximately 1984. Schultz Brothers filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy in 1988 ending the chain which at that time had 51 stores in four states.
