A Queen Anne style wing chair, early 20<sup>th</sup> Century, with cyma-curved mahogany legs, ending in pad feet, recently upholstered in green cut-velvet diamond patterned fabric, with burgundy piping trim.

A pair of mid-19<sup>th</sup> Century high style carved rosewood veneered and walnut Victorian parlor side chairs, probably English, having ornately-carved, pierced crest rail and back splat, ring-turned and tapered side stiles, deep, over-upholstered balloon seat, supported on ring-turned front legs, and simple, outset back legs, the front legs with castors.

**Two 3500****27. Four Refectory-Type Tables**

Four refectory-type tables, spanning the years from Elizabethan to Elizabethan Revival, including:

- a. an early-mid 17<sup>th</sup> Century walnut table, possibly English, having a straight-edge plank top, two frieze drawers, with stylized leaf-carved fronts, remainder frieze also carved, over dentilled molding surround, the whole supported on four ring-turned and tapered baluster legs, with box-stretchered base, (restorations throughout, top and base by association, worm damage).

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1. **Two Gothic Revival Side Chairs**

Two similar, but not matching, late 19th Century walnut side chairs, c.1870-1880, probably by the same maker, each having ornately carved back with pierced foliate and scrolled design, ring-turned side stiles, horseshoe shape, over-upholstered seat, supported by ring-turned, brass castored front legs, the rear legs having slight out-flared shape.

2. **French Ceramic Charger**

A late 19th Century French circular ceramic charger in velvet covered, molded wood frame, having a hand painted surface showing an elegantly dressed young woman riding side saddle on a dapple grey horse, a King Charles spaniel barking at the horse's feet, the background of raised, quatrafoil gilt design, a stylized chain design surround.
