





19. Continental Cassapanca

A mid-late 17th Century carved oak *cassapanca*, possibly French or Flemish, having a straight-edged top with two planked lift lids, each with staple or snipe hinges, raised structure at each end, incorporating arm rest and small lift-lid storage compartment possibly for candles, these upper side-structures, with lunette carved design, continuing to side stiles, the stiles centered by a five-paneled front, each panel with carved peasant figures, four panels with single male or female peasant, the central panel with man and woman holding hands, centered by tree, possibly representing the *Tree of Life* or the *Family Tree*, (this probably being a dowry chest), the front further trimmed with lunette carved upper and lower molding, the sides and back also paneled, however with no carved decoration.
