## Renaissance Style Cast-Bronze Andirons

A pair of late 19<sup>th</sup> - early 20<sup>th</sup> Century massive cast-bronze Renaissance style andirons, each having a rampant lion above, holding a shield, with floral coat of arms, the lion standing on a base ornately cast with grotesque masques, two bacchus-type figures, and finally ending in winged-lion feet, each lion, with head thrown back and tongue extended, the firewood support in rear, with urn finial stops.

# The Buffalo and Antelope Wall Murals by Robert Winthrop Chanler, (1872-1930)

The entire surface of the four walls and part of the vaulted ceiling are decorated in thick *impasto* plaster technique, with scenes of the American Far West, Indians on horseback, the open plains, Monument Valley, stampeding buffalo, grazing elk and moose, nesting and soaring eagles, (some minor losses). The murals were designed and painted by Robert Winthrop Chanler, an American painter and muralist who studied at the *Ecole des Beaux-Arts* in Paris. (Interestingly, his wife, Beatrice Ashley Chanler, was also a muralist, who incorporated *bas-relief* decoration in her work [murals at the Vanderbilt Hotel]. It is interesting to speculate if she helped in the execution of this project). Robert Chanler's work is represented at the Metropolitan Museum, New York.
