Solution on microfiber cleaning clothes and kimwipes, cleaned horns using soot removal sponges, then with 50% ethanol/water solution on swabs, and kimwipes, to degree possible, Cleaned metal earliners with 95% ethanol and to degree possible, cleaned ferrous metal hanging hardware using 95% ethanol. She coated hanging hardware + earliners using a thin solution of B-72 in reagent grade acetone, consolidated loose plaster under skin of nose and face using thin solution of B-72 acetone, made small fills in eyeline, made fills of Pliantex for backs of both ears, reattached loose lifted skin at creaks.
