Seat is $3\frac{1}{2}$ in in height. On the face of the seat, the center is sunken $2\frac{1}{2}$ in from the edge.

This chair replaces a desk chair given by Mrs. De Grat to complement the man's desk. The leather was in very poor condition & has been put into storage until it can be restored (Gilligan 11/5/1982).
