1. **William & Mary "Oyster-Veneered" Walnut  
Chest of Drawers**

A late 17th Century English William & Mary  
oyster-veneered walnut and string-inlaid  
chest of drawers, having concentric circle  
string inlaid top with straight, molded  
edge, over two short drawers, over three  
long graduated drawers, the drawers, top  
and sides cross-banded with walnut, with  
deep molded edge base, supported on four  
ball feet, engraved, batwing, bail-handle,  
staple-back brasses, and the wood darkly  
patinated overall warm color; (restoration  
to side cross-banding, some losses to moldings,  
feet are restored, brasses are early 18th  
Century and are probably replacements to  
the piece).
