The Appraised is equal to or better in quality and robustness of design to the best of the Comparable lot. Again, I have increased the Appraised value above the Comparable value due to the connection to the Coe family and the Planting Fields home. I have increased the value from \$140 per oz. to \$220 per oz.
