**Conservation Comments:**

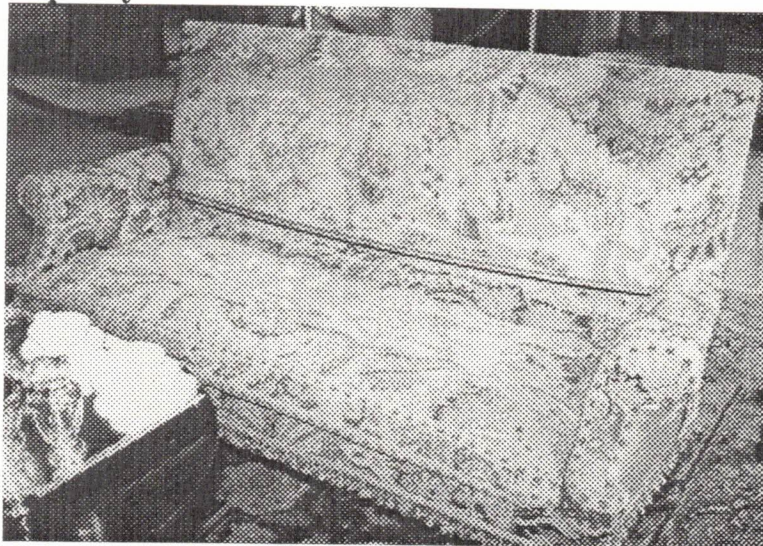
David Bayne: Both chairs need to be examined by Textile conservator with furniture conservator to determine condition. *DO NOT C. ALTMANS OR LIT*  
Small drop leaf appears stable.

**Recommendations:**

The delicate nature of the tapestries require careful vacuuming by trained housekeeper.

**Conservation Comments:**

William Clark:  
Finial for the stretchers is at home.

David Bayne: The stretchers are broken in several places and need repair. Fabric has been examined by Textile Conservator but additional exam of frame is necessary.

**Recommendations:**

Glue the breaks in the stretchers.  
Replace the finial.

Careful vacuuming is necessary (see above).

**29. Charles II Gate-Leg Table**

A mid-late 17<sup>th</sup> Century Charles II oak gate-leg table, with two curved drop leaves, over straight, molded-edge skirt frieze, supported on sausage-turned legs, ending in flattened ball feet, with two swing legs, sausage-turned, stretchers, (spliced feet, other restorations).

**30. Chippendale Style Bird-Cage Tea Table**

A Chippendale style piecrust, tilt-top tea table, early 20<sup>th</sup> Century, having curviate molded-edge top, over swivel bird cage design, supported on ring-turned and tapered fluted column, on shell and bell-flower carved tripod base, each leg ending in animal paw foot.

**31. Late Renaissance - Early Baroque Walnut Side Table**

An early 17<sup>th</sup> Century walnut and pine late Renaissance-early Baroque side table, probably Italian, having a straight-edge top, with bread-board ends, over single frieze drawer, of rabbetted channel side construction, button pull, supported on four simple, turned, tapered legs, ending in block and flattened-ball feet, "H"-stretchered base, (some restorations).

**32. Oak Charles I Style Joint Stool**

An oak Charles I style joint stool, probably early 20<sup>th</sup> Century, having a straight molded-edge top over straight, molded-edge skirt frieze, supported on ring-turned and tapered legs, ending in block feet, box-stretchered base.
