

33. Ornate Gothic Style Carved Oak Coffer

An ornately carved oak coffer, mid-19th Century, in Gothic style, probably English, having deeply molded straight edge top centered by carved *putti* head and flowers, with foliate surround, over the casket body, with densely carved scenes on the front and sides of the box, depicting the *Angel's Annunciation to Mary*; the *Visitation of Mary to her Cousin Elizabeth*; the *Nativity*; the *Appearance of Michael, the Archangel, to Jacob*; the back with a pair of winged cherub heads, the whole with deeply outset foliate-carved base molding, set on four flattened ball feet, (locked, lacks key).

(34.) William & Mary Style Two-Panel Blanket Chest

A William & Mary style oak two-panel blanket chest, probably of late 19th Century construction, of old 18th Century wood, reassembled, having a molded straight-edge top over a case with low relief carved wave and scroll design, over two recessed octagonal panels, with checkerboard inlaid side stiles and medial band, over two recessed panel drawers, with Queen Anne type escutcheons, and drop pulls, supported on turned turnip feet, (most hardware is antique, 18th Century, but not original to the piece, since the piece is about 100 years old, refinished).
