


World-Class Partners in Aviation

The McDonnell Douglas-Alaska Airlines partnership began in 1945 when the airline acquired the DC-3 to fly into remote corners of Alaska to support drilling operations and seismographic exploration. Alaska also operated the DC-4 in its growing fleet and used the aircraft to make the world's first commercial flight over the North Pole. In 1958, Alaska acquired the DC-6A and reduced flying time between Seattle and Alaska by two hours. Today, Alaska operates the MD-82 and the extended-range MD-83. McDonnell Douglas and Alaska Airlines celebrated a significant milestone in March 1992, when the airline received the 1,000th MD-80 produced. Alaska is also a launch customer for the new MD-90 twin jet.




