PATRICK'S DAY.</p> <p>PARADE OF THE ANCIENT ORDER.—LINE OF MARCH.—FINE APPEARANCE OF THE PROCESSION.</p> <p>As usual St. Patrick's day dawned any thing but pleasant. The walking was wretched, but notwithstanding this unpleasant feature, our Catholic friends attended service at St. Mary's Church at mass in the morning in large numbers. The Rev. Father Grace officiated.</p> <p>At about noon the Ancient Order of Hibernians, No. 1, of this city and Division No. 15, of the state, under the marshalship of Michael Burns, S. M. Horgan, the county delegate, being unavoidably absent from the city, started on their parade.</p> <p>The line formed on Thames street in front of their hall in Hilder's building and moved in the following order:—</p> <p>Platoon of Police,</p> <p>Messrs. Steel and Garnett.</p> <p>1st. U. S. Artillery Band, 20 pieces, Prof. K. Price, Leader.</p> <p>Ancient Order of Hibernians Division No. 1, of Newport and Division No. 15 of this state, under the marshalship of Michael Burns, 67 men.</p> <p>Barouche drawn by four horses containing the following officers of the society:—Michael Butler, president; Daniel S. Galvin, vice-president; Thomas Brady, financial secretary; J. J. Byrnes, recording secretary.</p> <p>The line of march was down Thames street to Lee avenue, up Lee avenue to Spring street, through Spring street to William street, up William street to Bellevue avenue, up Bellevue avenue to Kay street, through Kay to Mann avenue, down Mann avenue to Broadway, down Broadway to the Parade at which place the line came to a halt and were reviewed by his honor the mayor and the board of aldermen and councilmen after which it marched down the Parade to Thames street and down Thames street to the Hall, where the procession was disbanded.</p> <p>The order carried the elegant silk flag which was presented to it last St. Patrick's day by the ladies of Newport. They also carried the Irish flag and they hope that before they parade again they will be in possession of one belonging to the order of which they form a part.</p> <p>The men looked well in their showy regalia and attracted no little attention along the route of march.
