## RIBBON-CUTTING MARKS JUNE 11 OPENING OF INTERPRETIVE CENTER

n Saturday June 11 Museum members, friends, and local officials gathered to witness the ribbon-cutting ceremony marking the official opening of the Museum's new Interpretive Center at 648

Thames Street. The ceremony took place shortly after 10:00 a.m. and was led by Newport Mayor Steve Waluk and Museum President Vince Arnold, joined by Museum board member and City Councilor-at-Large, Harry Winthrop, Councilor-at-Large Naomi Neville, and Museum member and R.I. House District 75 Representative, Peter Martin. Numerous representatives from the local press, including the *Newport Daily News*, *Newport This Week* and *PatchNewport.com*, were on hand to cover the event, and upwards of 100 individuals visited the Center during its first official day of operation.

Visitors to the Center will learn about Irish immigration to Newport County from the 1600s to the present and of the many contributions made to our community by individuals of Irish descent. The Celtic-inspired seal of the new Interpretive Center (pictured above) and Center exhibits were designed by Holly Grosvenor of Northeast Collaborative Architects. The exhibits are organized around several key aspects of life in the local Irish community and include maps, photographs, video, and artifacts, including some from the construction of Fort Adams, which was built with Irish immigrant labor.

The Interpretive Center is open Thursday through Sunday, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., June through October. Appointments may be made for off-season and group tours. Admission for the general public is "By Donation" and admission is free for MNIH members, though donations are encouraged. 
### Solution Solutio
