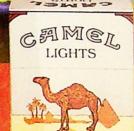

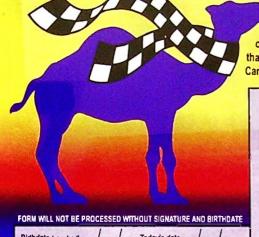

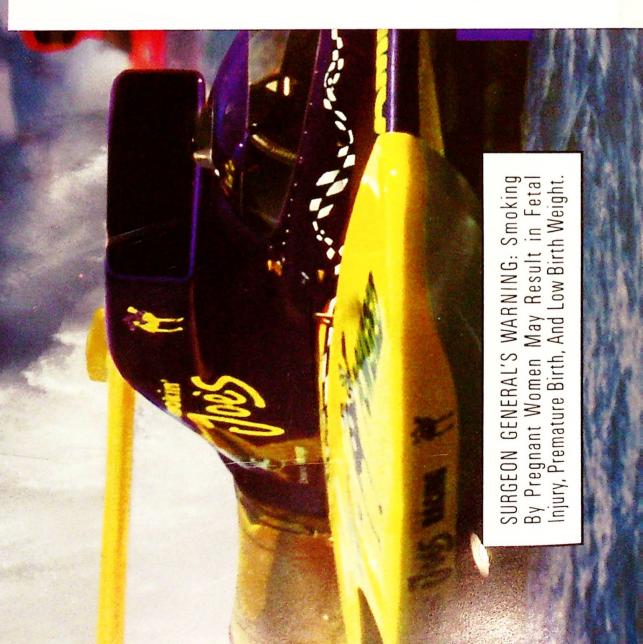

TRI-CITIES 1966 ATOMIC CUP

A BRIGHT SPOT IN A DOWN YEAR

It's hard to believe that almost 30 years have passed since unlimited hydroplane racing experienced its most devastating season in 1966. Four top drivers were tragically lost at races in Detroit and Washington, D.C. Critics called for a ban on the sport, or wanted the rest of the season cancelled. But the racing schedule continued.

In the midst of this gloom emerged an "oasis in the desert" -- the 1966 Tri-Cities Atomic Cup.

After months of selling, planning and working on the newest and biggest event to hit the Tri-Cities, race day finally dawned -- Sunday, July

24, 1966. An estimated crowd of 55,000 people was on hand to witness the start.

Just a few of the race contenders included: Dollar Bill and Bill Muncey, on loan from the Miss U.S.; Smirnoff and Bill Cantrell; Miss Chrysler Crew and Bill Sterett; Wayfarer's Club Lady and Bob Fendler; Miss Budweiser and Bill Brow; Harrah's Tahoe Miss

and Mira Slovak; Miss Tri-Cities and Bob Miller; Miss Madison and Jim McCormick; My Gypsy and Jim Ranger; Hilton Hy-perlube and Bob Gilliam; and Savair's Probe with Red Loomis.

The elimination heats had thrills, deck-todeck racing and the usual mechanical difficulties. In Heat 1-A, Harrah's Tahoe Miss went dead in the first lap, and My Gypsy was penalized a lap for destroying a buoy.

Driver Bill Sterett and his automotive-powered Miss Chrysler Crew put on a show that won the heat and excited the spectators -- everyone was ready for more!

Along with the Chrysler Crew, also victorious in the prelims were: Miss Budweiser (two heat wins) and Harrah's Tahoe Miss.

The unlimiteds that answered the starting gun for the six-lap fi-



nal were: Miss Budweiser, Miss Chrysler Crew. Smirnoff, Wayfarer's Club Ladv, Savair's Probe and Harrah's Tahoe Miss. Both

Budweiser and Chrysler Crew had to finish first to win the overall Atomic Cup title.

At the start, Bill Brow in the Miss Bud and Bill Sterett in Chrysler Crew charged hard towards the first turn. Bill Cantrell and The Smirnoff weren't far behind. Up the back chute, the Budweiser and Chrysler Crew raced side-by-side.

Suddenly, Chrysler Crew leaped from the water and lost power. Driver Bill Sterett threw both hands into the air indicating he was finished. It looked like an easy win for the Budweiser, but wait! Along came Mira Slovak in Harrah's Tahoe Miss.

Slovak passed Smirnoff for second place. He chased

and passed Budweiser. But just after starting lap four, the Tahoe Miss went dead, leaving Bernie Little's Budweiser in the lead. And that's the way it stayed.

REMEMBERING # FIRST RACE

MEMORIES ROLL VOLUNTEERS BACK TO 1966



"We were so scared that first race. We thought we had all the bases covered, but there was no way of knowing. Then on race day we had 10,000 more people than expected! Over 60,000 people turned

out for that first race. It was a blast!" Keith Bowers, Water Follies president, 1979 and one of the many Tri-Citians who helped bring unlimited hydroplane racing to

the area in 1966; and volunteer for 30 years.

"About one of every four businesses thought we

were absolutely, positively crazy, but they supported us nonetheless." Bob Loving, 1966 assistant course chairman and boat race volunteer for more than 20 years.

"I remember when I was approached to help with cranes. I didn't know much about hydroplanes, but I was immediately interested. I wanted to see these

boats race!" Neil F. Lampson, President of Neil F. Lampson Inc., and Water Follies president, 1984.

"Five of us went down to Tahoe to see how it (unlimited boat racing) was done. We took a lot of photos, measured everything, asked lots of questions and convinced the APBA to put us on the circuit. That's when the real work

began." Mark Pence, Tri-City Water Follies president, 1965.

"On race day, we couldn't use the entrance we use now. There was only one way into the park, at the

Richland Y. We couldn't believe it -- people were still arriving at

ternoon!" Ken

Maurer, one of the "Founders" of the Tri-City Water Follies and the event organizer today.

BLAST FROM PAST

ANTIQUE HYDROS BRING BACK THE THUNDER

Boat race enthusiasts will thrill to the roar of Rolls Royce Merlin, when antique hydroplanes come to town for the 30th anniversary of unlimited racing

in the Tri-Cities.

Scheduled to be on display in the pits and taking a few laps around the Columbia River race course are: the Miss Thriftway and the Hawaii Kai III. An all-time favorite, the Slo-mo-shun V, has also been invited to join the exhibition.

The U-60 Miss Thriftway is one of the most winningest boats in unlimited racing history. She

won 14 of 32 races entered, including two Gold Cups and three national champion titles. Bill Muncey drove her to his first Gold Cup victory in 1961. The Miss Thriftway retired from racing after competing from 1959 to 1963.

More than 70 volunteers, including original designer Ted Jones, took part in an effort at the Hydroplane and Raceboat Museum in Seattle to restore the U-60 Miss Thriftway to running condition.

The Hawaii Kai III was built by industrialist Edgar Kaiser and competed in the 1950s. She was driven by Jack Regas and, together, they won five



consecutive races and the National Championship in 1957.

Called the "Pink Lady" for her rose and coral colors, the Hawaii Kai III set several speed records in 1957, including the fastest lap at the Apple Cup Regatta, clocking 116 mph. She ran only one race in 1958, the Gold Cup, and rode off with the trophy!

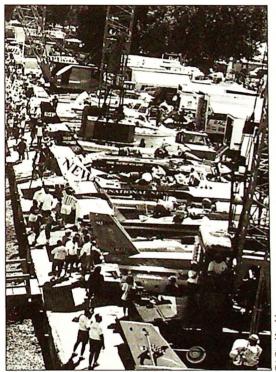
NEIL F. LAMPSON INC. CONTINUES TO BOOST WATER FOLLIES

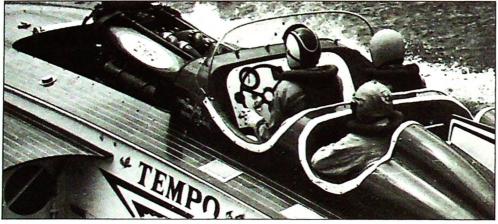

SMART BOAT MOVES KEEP BERNIE LITTLE AND BUDWEISER WINNING

Bernie Little arrived in Gunterville, FL., with his first boat, a four-seat pleasure craft named Tempo, a product of his association with famous band leader Guy Lombardo.



"I thought racing meant buying gasoline," said Little. "But when I saw the Miss Bardahl trucks and the sophistication of the Gala racing entou-

rage, I wondered what I was getting into."

Little's boat blew its engine, ending its chances of first-time success. A rival crew chief pointed out the Tempo's crankshaft had been installed backwards.

That made Little determined to become a winner in unlimited racing - and that he is - the winningest owner in history.

Three weeks later Little scored his first victory -- at the Atomic Cup in the Tri-Cities.

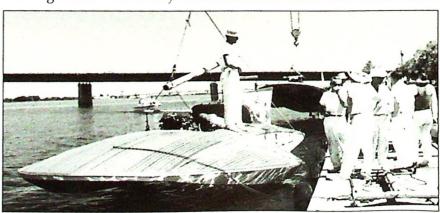
1967: The former Notre Dame hull was hastily recalled from mothballs to fill in as the Miss Budweiser

while a new boat was built.

1968-1972: The 1968 Miss Budweiser was the team's first superstar. It raced for five years, won 11 races (including two Gold Cups) and captured three straight High Point Championships. Drivers Bill Sterett, Terry Sterett, Dean Chenoweth and Tommy Fults all saw action behind the wheel.

1973-1975: In 1973, Miss Budweiser bore little resemblance to her predecessors. She was wider, flatter, sported a pickle-fork bow configuration and came with plenty of speed!

1976-1978: On its first day in the water, the new 1976 Miss Budweiser hit 175 m.p.h. on the straightaway driven by Howie Benns. But at the 1976 Detroit Gold





1966: In 1966, Little made a full commitment to the sport. He purchased the Miss Exide, which had won seven races and was the first boat to qualify for the Gold Cuprace at over 120 m.p.h. In the season opener, driver Bill Brow broke his shoulder. At the President's Cup in Washington, D.C., the Budweiser and relief driver Don Wilson collided with the Notre Dame, driven by Rex Manchester. Both boats were destroyed and the drivers were killed.

The fourth replacement Miss

Cup, she crashed in the final heat. A month later, the repaired flagship, driven by Mickey Remund, won the Seattle Seafair Regatta.

Miss Budweiser won the season High Point Championship in 1977. And in 1978, driven by Ron Snyder, Miss Budweiser won the Tri-City Columbia Cup.

1979: This year marked the first Miss Budweiser to use the powerful Rolls-Royce Griffon engine.

A backup hull stood in for the Griffon Bud at the first few races. But by season's end, driven by Chenoweth, the new boat was competitive. Unfortunately, while traveling at an estimated 226 m.p.h. well over the existing record of 200.419 - the boat lost its propeller and cudder, and was destroyed. Chenoweth escared with minor injuries.

RIDING WE OF SUCCESS

1980-85: Lessons learned were incorporated into the 1980 replacement which became the most victorious hull of them all. The boat won 22 races during its career and, with Chenoweth at the wheel, took first place in its first 20 heats of competition, an all-time record. In 1982, during a qualifying run on the Columbia River, Dean Chenoweth was killed.

1985-86: A new, canopied boat made its debut in 1985. The famed "Bubble Bud" was the first to have an enclosed F-16 aircraft canopy on a new Ron Jones designed hull.

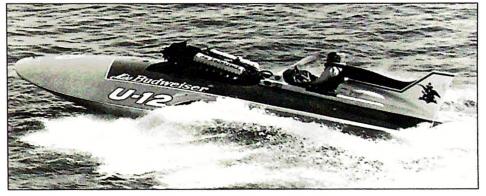
Its first competition was Syracuse, NY, when it was "chopped" by another boat in the final heat. The canopy saved Jim Kropfeld from injury. This was the last Miss Budweiser to use a Rolls-Royce Griffon. The boat retired in 1986 when Little began focusing on jet turbine power.



1986-1987: Hardly anyone expected the first turbinepowered Miss Budweiser to be much more than a test vehicle. Yet, this craft won another season championship.

1987-88: The Miss Budweiser team introduced a new high-tech Miss Budweiser for Little's 25th year in racing that overwhelmed the competition. Jim Kropfeld won five of the seven races and set a world qualification lap record of 155.172 m.p.h. on a 2 1/2-mile course in the Tri-Cities. The 1987 hull was retired and donated to the Smithsonian Institute in Washington, D.C.

After a bad accident in the 1988 season opener at Miami, hardly anyone expected the Miss Budweiser to repeat as High Point winner - but that is exactly what happened. And relief driver Tom D'Eath rebounded from a "blow-over" at



1989-90: The new 1989 Miss Budweiser is remembered as the boat that snapped Chip Hanauer's (driving the Miss Circus Circus) seven-year winning streak in the APBA Gold Cup. Miss Budweiser, driven by Tom D'Eath, won the final heat at 124.593 m.p.h. while Hanauer's Circus Circus sat dead in the water.

> 1991-93: Scott Pierce took over for Jim Kropfeld, and the team drove to yet another National High Points Boat Championship in 1991.

> In 1993 the winningest owner in history, Bernie Little, and the winningest driver, Chip Hanauer, joined forces. Their success continued with another High Points Championship, and Little captured his 13th national championship.

1994: In 1994, the team unveiled a new Miss Budweiser. The boat combined the

ideas of crew chief Ron Brown and crew members.

1995: It's been an exciting season for the Miss Budweiser Team. If their streak continues, Little and the Miss Budweiser team will capture their 100th career victory, and Chip Hanauer may surpass Bill Muncey's winning record.

"Communications is really the center of the races," says Quinlan. "Radios not only provide safety, they cut down on the legwork and help to keep the 'behind-the-scene' operations organized."

A QUICK LAP # TRACK

UNDERSTANDING UNLIMITED HYDROPLANE RACING

The 1995 Budweiser Columbia Cup is sure to be an exciting race. Stiff competition faces each driver. Understanding some of the rules and signals of the race will help race fans enjoy all the action!

To compete in the Budweiser Columbia Cup, turbine powered unlimited hydroplanes must qualify with a speed of 140 m.p.h. or faster. A piston-powered unlimited needs to reach 130 m.p.h.

Since the roostertails last flew in the Tri-Cities, a couple of rules have changed. The Last Chance Heat is now called the Provisional Heat and the selection of lanes has also been changed.

Heats 1A-B: Lane choice is by order of qualifying speeds. Heats 2A-B: Choice of lanes is by reverse order of finishing position in first heats.

Lane choice in the Provisional Heat is by cumulative points scored in preliminary heats. In the final, the Trailer Boat will start 600 feet behind the fastest six boats.

When a boat has problems, race fans can watch from shore and know what's going on by the driver's signals.

DRIVER SIGNALS:

Clasped hands above head. Everything OK. Need only routine assistance.

Waving Helmet. Driver uninjured but boat needs immediate assistance.

Waving both hands continuously above head. Driver in danger, needs immediate assistance. Racing is stopped to render aid.

Capsules. The canopy must be opened within 60 seconds after the boat comes to a halt or the referee will stop the race.

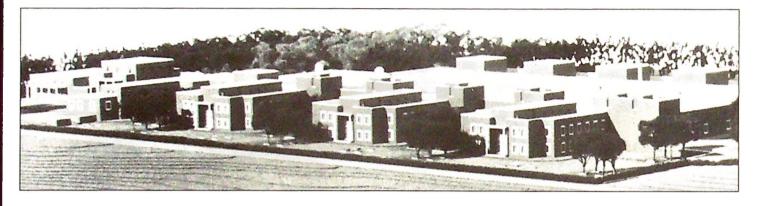

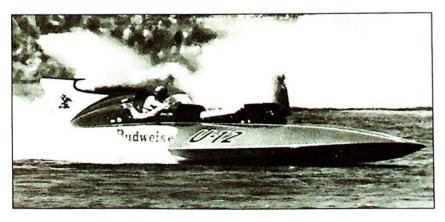

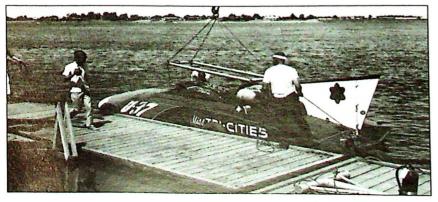


A TASTE OF COMPETITION...









The first race hosted by the Tri-Cities included famous names and hydroplanes...

At the inaugural Tri-Cities race, organizers worried the boats wouldn't show. By race day, Sunday, July 24, 1966, the pits were lined with magnificent machinery and charismatic drivers ready to compete in the first Atomic Cup.

What follows is a sampling of the boats listed in the first program and a few pieces of trivia from today.

U-3 HARRAH'S TAHOE MISS

Considered by racing buffs to be the hottest boat on the water when running well, Tahoe Miss has had a checkered career filled with high points and heartbreaks. She won this year's Gold Cup in Detroit. Mira Slovak, a Czechoslovakian air force pilot in the early 1950s, was injured at Coeur d'Alene in 1963 when Exide "disintegrated." He resumed racing this year with Tahoe Miss.

Mira Slovak entertained first year race fans with an aerobatic show including flying under the Blue Bridge. He retired from unlimiteds in 1968 and still flies airplanes and jets.

U-6 MISS MADISON

The only boat on the circuit campaigned by an entire city. This yellow and white craft is sponsored by the little Ohio River community of Madison, IN. This is Jim McCormick's first go at the unlimiteds in the popular Miss Madison.

The Miss Madison boat, still owned by the community, continues to race the circuit. This year, it's sponsored by Jasper Engines & Transmissions. McCormick is best remembered for winning the APBA Gold Cup with Miss Madison on the boat's home course.

U-12 MISS BUDWEISER

The Miss Budweiser racing here is a new boat, replacing the Miss Bud that was destroyed in the President's Cup in Washington, D.C. The boat is owned by Bernie Little. Bill Brow, the world's fastest milkman, is a Seattle dairy distributor during the weekdays and pursues hydro racing as a hobby on weekends.

Bernie Little's first victory came at the 1966 Atomic Cup. He is now the "winningest owner" with 96 wins, and has competed in all 30 races in the Tri-Cities. Budweiser is the only sponsor who has continued through the years.

U-37 MISS TRI-CITIES

This is the second member of the Tri-Cities' "inland fleet". She is the former Slo-Mo-Shun V, winner of the Gold Cup in Seattle in 1951 and 1954. Miss Tri-Cities is sponsored by the Tri-City Industrial Council to promote the outdoor recreational advantages of the Tri-City area. Driver Bob Miller, Everett, is a machinist for the Scott Paper Co.

Miss Tri-Cities raced only one more year, but the racing in Tri-Cities continued. Miller continued to drive until 1982. He seldom had much money to work with but was a tireless competitor, quite popular with colleagues and fans.

THRTY YEARS AGO



U-80 SMIRNOFF

The new Smirnoff is the former Gales' Roostertail that raced this year at Tampa, Washington D.C., and Detroit. Bill Cantrell is a pro wrestler and an Indianapolis 500 driver in addition to his unlimited racing.

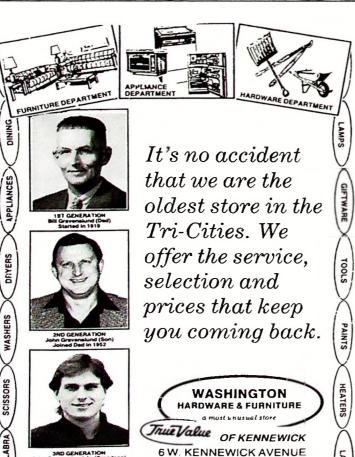
When Smirnoff raced in the Tri-Cities, Washington laws prohibited the Smirnoff bottle on the tail of the boat. It was covered by another bottle, A-1 Steak Sauce. "Wild Bill" Cantrell's career included 14 victories. Cantrell finished second at the 1966 Atomic Cup.

U-88 HILTON'S HY-PER-LUBE

U-88 raced the Western circuit last year as the Tri-City Sun under the sponsorship of the three Tri-City Chambers of Commerce and the Tri-City Water Follies. Bob Gilliam is the only driver to have driven an unlimited on the Columbia River in the Tri-Cities. He brought his boat, then the Tri-City Sun, here for a test run last fall.

Jim Harvey, who was a volunteer for Bob Gilliam in 1966, now owns the U-2 Miss T-Plus Engine Treatment, sponsored by the same Hilton Oil Corporation.

The Role of Public Ports

Public port districts in Washington State are the primary agencies dealing with economic development at the local level. Port districts have broad authority to encourage development of industry, commerce, trade, transportation and recreational facilities. They can develop property for industrial use and can lease and sell land, buildings and facilities to private industry. They are formed for acquisition, construction, maintenance and operation of harbor improvements, rail, air, water and motor vehicle transfer and terminal facilities and industrial improvements. Port districts also can issue revenue bonds for the acquisition or construction of various improvements.
