THE ATOMIC CUP TROPHY

The winner of the Atomic Cup will receive a "psych-atomic" letter-"A" trophy hand-sculpted out of solid walnut.

Designer and creator of the handsome 40-pound trophy is Lewis McCord of Kennewick, division chairman of the performing arts department, Columbia Basin College

"Psych-atomic" refers to the perspective of a person living within range of one of the world's largest atomic power installations. (Don't look for it in Webster's Unabridged!)

Atop the walnut free-form "A" — for Atomic — is a brass hydroplane racing over the atomic symbol, a globe circled by two rings, also executed in brass.

To carve the base from a four-inch slab of walnut, the artist says he used "a sander, chisels and a lot of elbow grease" plus about three solid days of tender loving care.


Staging the Atomic Cup

In 20 years, the Tri-City Water Follies has grown from a carnival to the largest sporting event in Eastern Washington.

The big step was taken last year when unlimited hydroplane racing was added to the Water Follies 10-

day list of events.

It was a \$75,000 gamble that paid off. The first running of the Atomic Cup in 1966 drew upwards of 50,000 people and showed a \$1,000 profit — considered a monumental achievement by first-year sponsors of an unlimited race.

In fact, the Tri-City race was one of the few on the unlimited race circuit that showed a profit to its sponsors. Its success is a tribute to efforts of the hundreds of people who worked on the project and to the community for its wholehearted acceptance and support of unlimited racing.

The racing people — drivers, owners and crewmen were in high praise of the conduct of last year's race, of Tri-City racing facilities and for the hospitality

shown by the Tri-Cities.

You can't stage an unlimited race unless it becomes a community project. Pay for everything you need at "list" price and you would easily be out from \$200,000

The Tri-Cities has a Water Follies and an Atomic Cup race only because of the donations in time, money and materials on the part of local individuals and busi-

What things are donated? Cranes, gravel, concrete, boats, machinery, trucks, electrical supplies, heavy equipment,supplies, equipment and services of all descriptions.

You need divers, crash boats, Coast Guard auxiliary, patrolmen, ticket takers....volunteers by the hundreds.

The Washington State Patrol, Corps of Engineers, Coast Guard and Tri-City law enforcement agencies

offered complete cooperation.

The Benton County Park Board, County commissioners and employees of Columbia Park — who play host to the Water Follies — gave their whole-hearted assistance.

Why is all of this done? So that the Tri-Cities may have a top out-door attraction. So that people throughout the United States may know of our "unlimited" recreational possibilities in terms of water, sun and facilities.

Does it work? Yes, indeed, unlimited racing does focus nationwide publicity quickly and effectively on our area. It has done it quicker than any other "vehicle" ever tried by the Tri-Cities.

Tri-City businessmen and individuals have again pledged financial underwriting for this year. Should the Atomic Cup lose money, these men will share the losses

on a pro-rata basis.

The Water Follies Association is a non-profit activity and funds realized from sponsored events are returned to the community in the form of capital improvements. Columbia Park, home of the Atomic Cup, has been the recipient of Water Follies donations in the form of such items as portable bleachers, boat docks and a boat launching ramp.

Improvements were made to Tri-City Atomic Cup facilities for this year's race. The pit area was expanded. Atomic Cup people built their own sled to handle buoys and anchors -- built their own timing clock that will

be in use for the first time this year.


