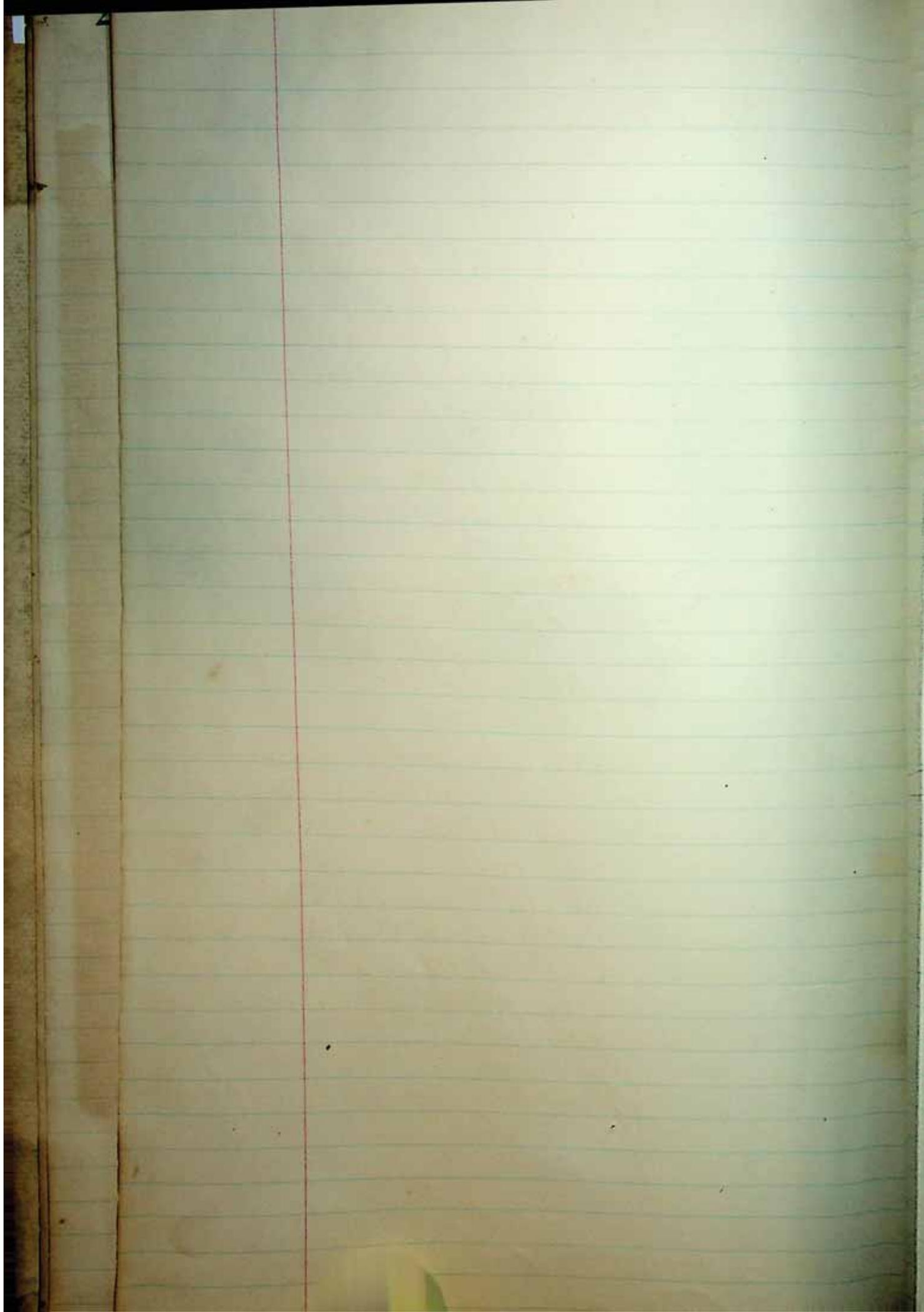

Dec 14 '86

About 12 A.M. Fire broke out in J. Q. Brown's
Carrriage Factory, supposed to have occurred by spontaneous
combustion. The Company responded to the Alarm
promptly and soon had our stream on, thrown from
the Canal about 1400 feet away. The fire spread
rapidly and soon Brown's War Room, residence
occupied by Gardner Brown and a residence
owned and occupied by P. L. Estes caught fire.
It soon became apparent that none of
these buildings could be saved, and the
Company directed their attention to keep
the fire from spreading to surrounding
buildings, which by hard & skilled work
were saved. The estimated loss on Mr. Brown's
property is about \$12000⁰⁰ Insurance
\$4500⁰⁰; on Mr. Estes's property about \$1200⁰⁰
Insurance \$850⁰⁰

Jan 18 '87

About 7 A.M. Fire broke out in a cooper
shop owned and occupied by DeFendoff & Son
supposed to have caught from a stove.
The Company responded promptly to the
alarm, but the building was nearly
consumed before the Company arrived.
The stream was thrown to protect
surrounding buildings. Loss about \$1000⁰⁰

company responded promptly and had me-

five minutes. In twenty minutes had
two more strams from fire engine.

It was evident that it was impossible
to save the building and the attention
was given to saving adjoining property
which by hard work was accomplished.

Article V.

Section 3:

Secretary. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a correct roll of the Co. and to call the same at all regular meetings and fairs, or whenever the commanding officers may deem proper; to keep a record of the proceedings of every meeting; and an account of all fines; to notify members of all meetings by postcard; to notify each new member of his election; obtain for him a certificate of membership as soon as such member shall have complied with the regulations of the Company, and place his name on the roll. To keep on file all documents relating to the business of the Company, He shall obtain of the Treasurer the names of all active members that are clear on the books and hand the same to the Village Clerk for Exemption from poll and real estate tax when called upon to do so by the said Clerk; and, upon the election of his successor, he shall deliver to him, within ten days, his books written up to date, together with all the

papers and other property in his possession and belonging to the Company.

Article V

Section 4.

Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be required to give bonds in the sum of \$500⁰⁰, subject to the approval of the Trustees, and deliver the same to the Secretary of the Company, to be placed on file with the documents belonging to the Company. It shall also be the duty of the Treasurer to keep an accurate account of all dues, assessments and fines; to report the amount due from each member at every regular meeting, and to collect the same; and he shall not hand in the name of any member of the Company for exemption from poll and real estate tax unless such member is clear on the books; to pay all bills approved by vote of the Company and signed by the President and Secretary; to keep a correct account of all money received and expended by him for the use of the Company, and to render a written report of the financial condition of the Company at each regular meeting; to present his account current, with his vouchers, to a committee of three members appointed by the Company at a regular meeting preceding the regular Annual Meeting; and upon the election of his successor, he shall deliver up to him, within ten days, his books, written up to date, together with all the Company papers and

property in his possession.

Article IX,
Section 1.

Any member may propose a candidate to the Secretary, who shall make the same known to the Committee of Inquiry, and on the report of the Committee, if the same be favorable, the Company shall proceed to ballot.

Article X,
Section 4.

Any honorary member desiring to be placed on the ~~active~~ active roll, shall have his name proposed to the Secretary, who shall make the same known to the Committee of Inquiry, and on the report of the Committee, if the same be favorable, the Company shall proceed to ballot.

Article XIII.

The uniform of this Company shall be similar to the sample in charge of the Property Clerk, and shall consist of cap, red shirt, belt, pants, and fire-badge the badge to be worn at all times. Any addition or change shall require a three-fourths majority vote of the active members of the Company. It shall be worn at every regular meeting, and at such other times as ordered.
