

That the Chief be instructed to invite the neighboring Chiefs who assisted our Department in its Mutual-Aid Demonstration. It was decided to hold the dinner in January and the date would be set at the discretion of the following named committee: C. Maurhofer, assisted by Fred Adams, W. Ward, C. Koehler, C. Clark, H. Verhow, C. Wagner, C. Hewitt and H. VanDorp. *Sam Piker in charge of music.*


A letter was received from the Brooks-Shepard Post extending thanks for the use of our Hall for their Turkey Raffle.



HOUSE RULES FAIRPORT FIRE DEPT.

Article 1

- Section 1. Any member marking or defacing or otherwise damaging any property belonging to the Fairport Fire Department shall be subject to pay the value of such injury or damage as appraised by the House Committee and trustees.
- Section 2. Property of the Fairport Fire Department shall not be loaned or rented to be taken from the premises by anyone at any time.
- Section 3. Any member conduction himself otherwise than a gentleman or conduct unbecoming to a fireman on the premises of the Fairport Fire Department shall be reported by the House Committee to the Department, and upon conviction by two-thirds vote of a meeting of at least sixty members, who shall have been duly notified, shall be suspended or expelled.
- Section 4. Any person not a member of the Fairport Fire Department or visiting firmen shall not frequent the premises or participate in any activities on said premises.
- Section 5. A House Committee of three shall be elected by the Department, one member from each company as follows:- one for one year, one for two years and one for three years. At the expiration of the term of each, his Company may recommend his successor to be elected for three years. Said committee shall enforce House Rules and be responsible to Fairport Fire Department.
- Section 6. Any member violating or transgressing any of these Rules or aiding or abetting in the same shall be considered as conducting himself otherwise than as a gentleman and a fireman and be punished according to the provisions named in Section 3.
- Section 7. A resolution to amend these House Rules may be presented in writing at any regular or special meeting of the Department, and may be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the members present at a meeting, thirty days subsequent after a written notice has been given of such a meeting.

FAIRPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT

Section 8. The Lounge or Club Room shall be used as such only and shall not be used or rented in conjunction with the Hall at any time, except on Department functions.
