




Regular meeting of the Fire Dept. was called to order in the Fire Hall at 8:20 PM by President George Goodrich.

President Goodrich apologized for the late start and asked that in the future the men be prompt, then the meetings could start on time and the business could be cleared rapidly so the members could be free to leave early or enjoy the entertainment of the evening/

The minutes of the annual meeting were read to the dept. - Motion by Albert Clark 2nd by George Monteith to accept the minutes as read. Motion carried.

The following bills were read to the Dept.

Ralph Estey - \$ 5.00, tune piano - H. Hooper \$ 7.73 cost of lunch served after meeting. - Wayne Morrison Press printing of Show Program \$ 9.00 - Mr. Bartolotta \$ 25.00 for corsages for girls in Minstrel Show. - Bryant Printery \$ 38.00 for printing new By-Laws of Department. - Levis Music Co. \$ 21.51 for music for Minstrel Show. - Masline Corp. \$ 297.20 for Public Address sound system complete with accessories for outside use. - Mrs. Schreiber \$ 36.70 for rent of Minstrel Show Costumes.

Motion by Paul Marsh, 2nd by Irving Anderson to pay these bills - Motion Carried.

Motion by Geo. Monteith, 2nd by Gardner Lewis - that the Treas. be instructed to divide equally the profits, from the Minstrel Show, between the three Fire Companies Motion Carried.

A letter from the Georgetown, Conn. Fire Dept. was read to the Dept. This letter told of the misfortune of the Georgetown Fire Dept. in losing all their equipment building, etc. in a fire and had two books of tickets worth \$ 2.00 for chances on a Plymouth Sedan to be awarded to the winner of lucky ticket. The proceeds from these tickets to help defray the expense of new equipment. Motion by Carlton Clifford 2nd by George Monteith to purchase these tickets. - Motion carried.

A letter with a check for \$ 25.00 was received from Mr. Reginald Kiefer, thanking the dept. for the work done at his home when it caught fire from torches being used by painters removing old paint. The secretary was instructed to acknowledge letter.

A letter from Eugene Braun, secretary of State Firemen's Assoc. was read to the Dept. Mr. Braun told of the tremendous loss of life and property due to fires and of plan the state Assoc. was outlining to help prevent this loss thru educational posters and calendars which would soon be for sale by the Fire Dept's. and of the means of enriching our treas. thru sale of these calendars.

The Treasurers report was read to the Dept. Motion by Gordon Murphy 2nd by Tom Roe to accept the treas. report as read. - Motion carried.

Motion by Warner Williams 2nd by John Ellis to donate \$ 60.00 to Mr. Frank Noonan for directing the Minstrel Show. - Motion Carried.

President Goodrich instructed the secretary to write letter of thanks to Francis Hennessey for his part in the Minstrel Show.

Motion by George M^Untieth, 2nd by Ed. Skeates to donate \$ 10.00 to the school janitor for his help at the M^Unstrel Show. - Motion carried.

Motion by Chief Malcolm, 2nd by Ed. Skeates that the Dept. reimburse Rowe Stutzman for repairs to his glasses broken at the Minstrel Show. - Motion carried.

Motion by Clarence Lewis, 2nd by Ed. Francis to donate \$ 5.00 each to Leora Wagner and Helen Spafford for their work at the Minstrel show. - Motion carried.

Motion by Don. Williams, 2nd by C. Koehler that the secretary be instructed to send letters of thanks to Mr. Guy DeTro-Mr. Earl N. cholson - Miss Jane Andrews & Miss Jessie Wood for their part in the Minstrel Show. - Motion Carried.

Chief Don. Malcolm made the following report on the activities of the Fire Dept. since the April Meeting. a total of 18 alarms were answered. 4 of these being calls for the 1st Aid crews. 1-Mr. Helms, East Church Street, overcome by coal gas fumes he was revived and taken to the hospital-Mr. I. Anderson and Mr. H. Dryer attending Mr. Helms till turned over to the hospital. 2-Call to Mr. R. Wahle's, where their new baby was worked over with inhalator but was pronounced dead by the Dr. death due to enlarged thymus gland. 3-Call to North side school, where Mr. Bailey had hanged himself- but there was nothing the Dept. could do as Mr. Bailey was dead when Dept. arrived. 4-Call to North Main Street, where a baby had fallen from high chair and was knocked out-was OK when Dept. arrived. The rest of the calls were for grass fires and other small fires of now consequence.

The Dept. recently received 12 pairs of boots, 6 lined fire coats, and 4 Indian Fire Pumps. Chief Malcolm told the Dept. that we were now expected to fill in at Brighton Fire Hall # 1 when Brighton was called from their district. Chief Malcolm appointed the following men ~~to~~ to have command of the marching units. V. Wagner chairman, Fred Maybee and Ed. Francis to assist Mr. Wagner. The members of the Dept. were told that any one wishing instruction on the operation of the trucks or mutual aid to report to the fire hall Sunday mornings at 9:30 AM.

Motion by Ed. Skeates, 2nd by Tom Roe that the Dept. donate \$ 25.00 to the Fairport-Perinton Community chest drive. - Motion carried.

Motion by C. Koehler, 2nd by I. Anderson that the Dept. donate \$ 50.00 to the Monroe County Volunteer Firemen's Assoc. to help defray expenses of Chief's Convention to be held in Rochester June 8-11, 1947. Motion carried.

Motion by John Ellis, 2nd by Ed. Skeates to adjourn.- Motion carried.

An invitation from East Rochester to attend the 50th Anniversary celebration of the founding of their Village was read to the Dept. This event to be held Saturday May 31st, 1947 at 3 PM. Motion by Geo. Montieith, 2nd by Geo. Hurlburt to attend this celebration. - Motion carried.

The band committee was granted authority to secure band for this occasion.

Clarence Buss spoke on behalf of the Legion Posts, asking the Fire Dept. to take part in the Memorial day exercises. Motion by Harry Luke, 2nd by Geo. Montieith that the Dept. march in the Memorial Day parade. - Motion carried.

An invitation from West Webster asking the Dept. to take part in their Annual parade was read to the Dept. This parade to be held July 31st. at 7:30 PM.

Motion by C. Koehler, 2nd by Al. Pelton, that due to the fact that the West Webster parade was the same date as our own parnival that the Dept. send one truck and few men to the West Webster Parade. - Motion carried.

An invitation from Springwater Fire Dept. was read to the Dept. asking us to take part in the parade to be held Friday June 13th at 7:30 PM. Motion by Ed. Skeates 2nd by Fred Maybee to send Swuad Car and few men to Springwater parade - Carried.

An invitation from Penn Yan Fire Board was read to the Dept. asking us to attend their parade Wednesday July 9th at 7:30 PM. Motion by I. Anderson, 2nd by H. VanDorpe to decline Penn Yan invitation due to the great distance involved. - Carried.

An invitation from Penfield Fire Dept. asking us to attend parade to be held Sat. July 19th at 4:30PM was read to the Dept. - Motion by John Ellis, 2nd by H. Newman to attend Penfielf Parade. - Motion carried.

An invitation from Brighton Fire Dept. asking us to attend their parade to be held Friday July 11th at 7:30 PM was read to the Dept. - Motion by Fred Maybee, 2nd by H. Newman to attend the Brighton parade. - Motion carreid.

An invitation from the Caledonia Fire Dept. asking us to attend their parade to be held June ~~18-21st~~ was read to the Dept. Motion by Peter DeRidder, 2nd by H. Dryer to decline the invitation to Caledonia. - Motion carried.

An invitation from Rush Fire Dept. asking us to attend their parade and carnival to be held June 18-21st was read to the Dept. Motion by Fred Maybee, 2nd by John Elli to decline Rush invitation - motion carried.

An invitation from Barnard Fire Dept. asking us to take part in their parade to be held Wednesday July 9th at 7:30 PM was read to the Dept. Motion by C. Koehler, 2nd by P. DeRidder to attend Barnard's parade - motion carried.

An invitation from Fisher's Fire Dept. asking us to attend their parade June 26th at 7:30 Pm was read to the Dept. but due to the fact that this date is the same as the date of N.C.V.F. Assoc. convention the dept decided to wait till June meeting before accepting this invitation.

Motion by Fred Maybee, 2nd by A. Pelton that the Dept. attend the N.C.V.F. Assoc convention to be held at Canandaigua June 26th early PM - Motion carried.

Motion by H. Luke, 2nd by C. Buss that the Band Committee have authority to hire extra bands to fill in for extra parades as the Comm. has already contracted with the Memorial Post Band for 10 parades for the sum of \$1500.00 - Motion carried.

The Committee on grounds for the Dept. asked permission to secure services of the Village engineer to help estimate the cost of filling and grading the lot on Whitney Road. - Permission granted.

Motion by Fred Maybee, 2nd by Gordon Murphy that the Dept. have dinner honoring the Exempt Firemen. Motion Carried.

2nd Asst. Chief Cal. Stewart asked the members of the Dept. to make returns on their tickets so he could give report on Minstrel Show.

A letter of thanks and appreciation for donation to Red Cross was read to the Dept.

A letter of thanks for the use of Fire Hall for meetings was received from the Commander, Mr. Ted King, V.F.W.-Perinton Memorial Post #8495 and the Post promised help to the Dept. when we hold our Carnival .

Meeting adjourned.

Firemen's Assoc. due to the fact that the Dept. does not belong to the N.C.V. Firemen's Assoc. this letter was referred to the various Companies for further action.

The Treasurers report was read to the Dept. - Motion by Ralph Wilson, 2nd by Tom Roe to accept the Treas, report as read. - Motion Carried.

A card of thanks was received from the Aldrich Family and also from Mrs. Anna Jordan for the flowers sent to Mrs. Matie Aldrich from the Dept.

Motion by George Montieth, 2nd by John Ellis that the Dept. leave to the discretion of the Chief's the acceptance or refusal of invitations to various Fire Dept. Parades and Carnivals. - Motion Carried.

Chief Donald Malcolm reported that the Dept. had answered three alarm since the May meeting- one call to Macedon Center and two calls in town. Rescued one cat from tree- set ladder so mason could do repair work on school on West Church St. and flooded the area for Raymond Moore to set base for his building on Main Road just West of Village. Don also told us that a new lighting system had been ordered and also that the Village Board had been asked to purchase a new Hook & Ladder Truck and that the Village Board promised some action in the near future in regards to the new truck.

Motion by Clarence Buss, 2nd by H. Van Dorpe- that the motion made at the May 13th meeting in which the Dept. declined the invitation to Caledonia Fire Dept Parade, be rescinded. - Motion carried.

Motion by C. Buss, 2nd by Peter DeRudder that due to additional information now received that the Dept. Attend the Caledonia Fire Dept. Parade to be held Friday June 6th at 7:00 PM. - Motion Carried.

Motion by John Ellis, 2nd by Tom Roe that the Dept. Adjourn. - Motion carried.

Regular meeting of the Fairport Fire Department was called to order in the Fire Hall at 8:10 PM. by president George Goodrich.

Minutes of the June meeting were read to the Department and there being no corrections, the president declared the minutes approved as read.

Bills totaling \$ 518.34 were presented to the Department. Motion by George Montieth, 2nd by Earl Morrison that these bills be paid. - Motion carried.

Communications as follows were read to the Dept. - A card from the Flower City Lodge # 91(Elks Club) of 285 Clarissa St. telling of their drum corps. address all requests to Mr. Adelbert Thompson Band Master. - A letter of thanks for gift from Dept. was received from Chas. Kopp, who is recuperating from illness. - A letter of thanks with check for \$ 5.00 was received from Mr & Mrs. George Semmler for use of Squad car on call Jan. 4th, 1947. - A letter of thanks with check for \$ 10.00 was received from the Fairport Rotary Club, for use of the Fire Hall for their auction. President Goodrich spoke of the good done by the Rotary Club and stated that if there were no objections the Dept. would return the check to the Rotary Club and so instructed the secretary. - Secretary returned check and letter thanking the Rotary club for their thought.

The treasurers report was read to the Department. - Motion by George Montieth 2nd by Vincent Wagner to accept The treasurers report as read. - Motion carried.

2nd Asst. Chief Cal. Stewart invited the members of the Dept. to attend the Western Vol. Firemen's Assoc. convention parade to be held in Williamsville, N.Y. Wednesday July 23rd at 6: PM. as guests of the Hose Co. who are members of the Western Assoc.

Chief Don Malcolm reported that there were two fires during the month of June as follows. Temple Sweet shop damage estimated at \$ 3500.00 and a grass fire on Whitney road, no damage. Don also reminded the fellows of the work ahead at the carnival and also asked for help in moving the tents which the Dept. owns and are renting to various fire companies. The tents are usually set up every Sunday morning and in like manner are moved from place to place and any one wishing to help should be at the Fire Hall Sundays at 9:30 AM.

Motion by Cal. Stewart 2nd by Thomas Roe to adjourn - Motion carried.

Firemen's nite unless there was an agreement between the Fire Dept. of Palmyra and the Fair Assoc. which would benefit the Fire Dept. but that we would attend the Fire Dept. affair. Motion carried.

The Fairport Fire Dept. won \$ 10.00 for 2nd best appearing and \$ 15.00 for best non-firemen's band at Barnard Fire Dept. parade.

Motion by John Ellis 2nd by Fred Maybee to adjourn - motion carried.

The Treasurer read bills pertaining to the Carnival and including Parade awards in the amount of \$ 1233.52. These bills were ordered paid and the treasurer was ordered to include the bill for the Electrolux Cleaner as Mr. MacFarland had not presented his statement at this date.

Receipts to date for the Carnival totaled \$ 4918.04 with Hilton Dryer's ticket money to be added.

President Goodrich complimented the Department on the fine way the Carnival was conducted and thanked the members for their cooperation in making it a success.

The Secretary was instructed to write a letter of thanks to the Veterans of Foreign Wars for their help and assistance at our parade.

Ed. Francis announced that the V.F.W. would hold a parade on Friday evening August 15th and would appreciate any assistance and help the Firemen could offer.

Ralph Burrus requested that we express our thanks to Mr. John Maloney for the use of his grounds for our Carnival and the secretary was instructed to write a note of thanks.

Roll Call showed 42 present and the light attendance was later compensated when it was found that our three chief's and several members were working at the Carnival grounds.

Motion was made and seconded that we adjourn. - motion carried.

Motion by Ralph Wilson 2nd by Clarence Buss to accept the invitation to attend the Torch Light Parade in Geneva, Friday September 12th at 6:30 PM.-Motion carried.

Chief Malcolm thanked the members for their attendance at the various parades this past summer and for their help at the carnival and fires and in setting up and moving the tents which we have rented to Fire Depts this season. Chief Malcolm stated that starting Tuesday Sept. 9th and every tuesday thereafter that there would be practice for the fellows at the Fire Hall in the evening for all who wished, to learn to operate the trucks and the handling of the ladders. There were six alarms since August meeting 4 out of town, 1 emergency and 1 local fire.

Motion to adjourn was regularly moved and 2nd and the President so moved.

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September 16, 1947

Special Meeting of the Fairport Fire Department was called to order in the Fire Hall at 8:15PM. by President George Goodrich.

President Goodrich stated that due to the fact that Chief Don Malcolm wished to have this special meeting called to order that the meeting would be turned over to Chief Malcolm. Don explained the purpose of the meeting as being twofold, one reason was to discuss the contracting of the Canandaigua Drum Corp. for the parades which the Department would attend during the 1948 season. The Canandaigua Drum Corp. stated that they would play for twelve (12) parades and also play at the Fairport Fire Dept. Carnival for the sum of Fifteen (\$1500.00) Hundred Dollars.

There was much discussion concerning the hiring of the drum corp. and the Dept. was informed that there was a possibility of the V.F.W. forming a Band for the next season.

Motion by Warner Williams 2nd by Al. Pelton That the Canandaigua Drum Corps be informed that we could not give them an answer until after our October meeting at which time we would know if the V.F.W. band was actually going to be formed and if it was going to be formed, the Fairport Fire Dept. would prefer to hire a band from it's home town. - Motion Carried.

The other purpose of the meeting was to discuss the carnival for 1948. After a bit of discussion concerning an idea which Chief Malcolm explained to the Dept. the following motions were passed.

Motion by Sam Pitcher that the Fairport Fire Dept. hold a three (3) day Carnival the first Thursday, Friday and Saturday in August, 1948. motion 2nd by *Carl Puff*
Motion Carried. *aug 5-6-7, 1948*

Motion by Sam Pitcher 2nd by Mark Bowlby That for one year the Fire Dept. would not have out of town concessioners at the carnival except for the rides but that all churches, lodges, scouts, and other organizations in Fairport be contacted to see if they would operate a stand, concession or exhibit on a percentage basis, to be decided on later. Motion carried.

The secretary was instructed to inform John Fisher, sec. of the County Assoc. of the dates of our Carnival and all other interested Fire Depts.

President Goodrich told of the sudden death of Lewis Reid and stated that there had been a request for bearers from the Fire Dept. The following men offered their services. Don. Malcolm, Cal. Stewart, Don Williams, George Hurlburt, Ray Coomber and Sam Pitcher. The men were to wear their Firemen's uniforms.

Motion by Mark Bowlby, 2nd by Sam Pitcher, that the president appoint a comm. to contact the organizations in town and also to try to contract rides for the Carnival. Motion carried.

The President appointed the following on this comm.- Chief Don Malcolm, 2nd Asst Chief Wm. Dancy. 2nd asst Chief Cal. Stewart, Vice president Don Williams and himself (Geo. Goodrich)

Motion by Mark Bowlby, 2nd by Al. Pelton to adjourn.- Motion carried.

October 6th, 1947

Regular meeting of the Fairport Fire ^Department was called to order in the Fire Hall at 8:10 PM. by President George Goodrich.

Minutes of the previous meetings were read to the department and ordered approved as read.


