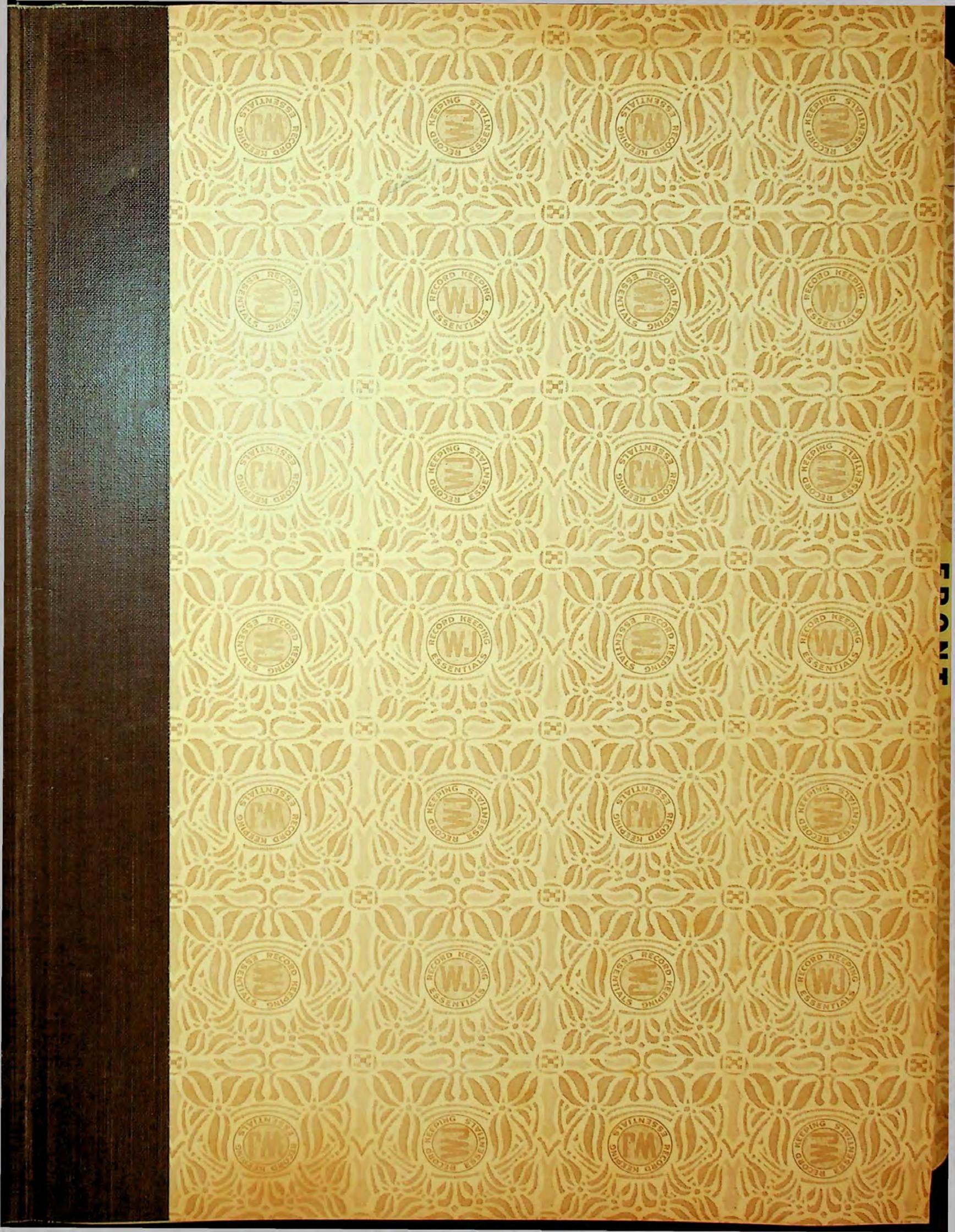

Regular meeting of the Fairport Fire Department was called to order in the Fire Hall at 8:10 PM. by President Chas. Beck.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read to the Dept., there being no corrections the minutes were approved as read.

President Chas. Beck introduced Nicholas Marchioli, a new member of the DeLand Hose Company.

The treas. presented bills totaling \$ 2.69. Motion by J. Schrader 2nd by Les Crane to pay these bills. Motion carried.

Invitation from Centennial Comm. to take part in the Village celebration, asking us to operate a concession and manage the parade.

Letter from Town of Perinton telling of new contract to be signed Thurs.

Nov. 10th, 1966 and asking the President and Secretary to be present.

Motion by Wm. Rich 2nd by Les. Crane that the Dept. pass at this time the request of the State Assoc. for donation to Home on the Hudson, due to the large donation we made in the spring. Motion carried.

Motion by Fred. Peck 2nd by J. Kenney that the Dept. check with the Centennial committee in regards to the 4th of July parade before any action be taken on their invitation. Motion carried.

Motion by Cal. Stewart 2nd by J. Erbland that the President and Secretary attend the Town Board meeting, Thursday Nov. 10th, 1966 and be empowered to accept the new contract. Motion carried.

The treas. report was read showing receipts of \$ 60.00, disbursements of \$899.04 leaving a balance of \$ 616.91 in cash, \$6000.00 in the Loan and \$ 5075.62 in the interest account at Security Trust Co. Motion by F. Peck 2nd by Wm. Rich to accept the treas. report as read. Motion carried.

At this time the President introduced Mr. Miller from Webster who demonstrated the Electron radion receiving sets. These are smaller sets and can be used in the home on regular current or in the car on car battery and also can be purchased with batteries and charger in set, cost from about \$ 120.00 to \$ 140.00. Mr. Miller told of the Fire Companies now operating these sets and of the extremely low operating cost, about a \$1.00 per year for average. Many questions were asked and answered, there being no further questions Mr. Miller was excused.

Ralph Wood reported that the Trustee had several quotes on repairing the Hall and these quotes were broken down so all or part of the work could be done, would have final by December meeting.

H. Broomfield reported on the Jackets, stating that there were many questions to be answered, such as to payments by the members, how long to carry on this project, measurements, etc. and if the Dept. wanted to purchase these Jackets.

Motion by R. Clement 2nd by Fred Peck that the Dept. purchase the jackets as explained by the Committee. Motion carried.

Motion by G. Trowell 2nd by J. Schrader to terminate the purchase of these jackets, Jan. 1st, 1967. (This would include all new members added to the roll call by this date), (and providing the material was available) Motion carried. Vice Pres. H. Broomfield said he would prepare a letter to be mailed to all members stating time of measurements and telling members their share of the money and to be paid at time of measurement. Possible dates 11-14 & 11-21 -7:30 to 9:30PM.

At this time President Chas. Beck turned the meeting over to Chief Ivan Masclee who introduced the Mayor Albert Knapp, Vice Mayor Gordon Murphy and Trustees Richard Gastor and E. H. Hare, of the Village Board who wished to discuss the expenditures of monies for the Fire Dept. Gordon spoke for the Village Board stating of the request for a Snorkle unit, this could not be housed at this time and that there was a new complex or else a remodeling of present facilities, to come soon. The dept. has about \$ 20,000.00 in equipment at this time. The Board was setting aside monies for future equipment. That the cost of operation at this time for insurance, repairs etc. is about \$ 40,000.00 per year. The Village Board is governed by the Fire Underwriters, and they are satisfied at this time with the equipment we have but that the Village Board will keep abreast of the situation and as always will work with the Fire Department. Mr. Murphy answered several questions.

Jim Schrader thanked the Village Board for their explanation of expenses and stated that this was the first time to his knowledge that the situation had been explained by the Village Board to the Fire Dept.

Chief Ivan Masclee reported that there were 11 alarms during October, a copy of same being on file.

John Fitzgerald and Les Crane spoke about their trip to the State Clearing house meeting and of the trip thru the Home on the Hudson.

2nd Asst Chief Red Newman told the fellows that the State training classes would start at East Rochester Fire Hall November 9th, 1966 and all who could should attend these classes. The members were warned about the wet roads and slippery times ahead and stated that the men should be careful in handling the equipment and also to use caution in driving their cars to the fires.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

Motion by C. Stewart, 2nd by R. Bergen to donate same amount to County Health Assoc. as in previous years, Motion carried.

It was reported that Ted. Phillips would be brought to Rochester this day, Ted suffered a severe Heart attack while hunting at Saranac and had been in the hospital up there for three weeks. It is expected that he will be in Rochester Hospital for a while and then home for a few months before working again.

President Chas. Beck stated that the new jackets were ordered and that any one who did not get measured could get a slip from either Chas. Beck or Harold Marsh and go to the city for measurements, deadline for this would be Dec. 31st, 1966.

Pres. Beck explained that the Centennial Committee would like to have the Fire Dept. handle the parade on July 4th, 1967 also to include the Vets. and Am. Legion in this venture. The committee ~~also~~ also asked the Dept. to handle a stand on Sunday, possibly a Pig-Roast.

Motion by Wm. Rich 2nd by H. Dryer that the Dept. handle the parade Tues. July 4th, 1967 in conjunction with the Vets. and Legion. Motion carried. The Pres. asked Vice President H. Broomfield to head up the committee for parade.

Motion by R. Bergen 2nd by T. Pittinaro that the Dept. handle the Pork Roast on Sunday July 2nd, 1967. Motion carried. Pres. Beck appointed J. Aparo chairman and J. Wi;son Asst. for this venture. Jim to pick committee.

R. Keenan spoke about the building improvements, there was a lot of discussion about this matter and there is to be some plans presented at Jan. meeting.

Pres. Chas. Beck asked Vice Pres. H. Broomfield to head up the Band committee for parades next year and also to handle the Xmas baskets from the Dept. Chas. also reminded R. Keenan and J. Aparo of the Fund drive and stated that he would appoint one other member to the Fund committee.

The treas. report was read showing receipts of \$970.00, disbursements of \$972.00 leaving a balance of \$ 8000.00 in Loan, \$614.03 in cash and \$ 5075.62 in interest acct. at Security. Motion by J. Fitzgerald 2nd by Bob. Brown to accept the treas. report as read. Carried.

Included in the above report was a bill for insurance on Ladies Aux. for \$ 27.00 motion by Keenan 2nd by J. Wilson to pay this bill. Motion carried.

Motion by C. Stewart 2nd by J. Kenney That the Sec. be given permission to have Fire Alarm cards and telephone stickers with new phone numbers printed, get enough for Fund Drive. Motion carried.

Motion by J. Fitzgerald 2nd by Wm. Rich that the Dept. attend the NCVFA parade in Newark this coming June. Motion carried.

Motion by R. Bergen 2nd by Robt. Brown that the Dept. hold a smorgasboard after the Newark parade if suitable place could be found, if not that the feed be held after some other parade. Motion carried.

Jack Faucher spoke about time element on insurance policies but it is not feasible to get more than two years at this time.

There was some discussion about Radios. The big item on radios is the upkeep. Jack Kenney reported that the Telephone Co. had a hook up which was a little expensive to install but that maintenance was the responsibility of the phone co. It was decided that the Dept. would like to know more about the phone hook up and Jack is to have more information at Jan. meeting.

Chief Ivan Masclee reported that there were 10 alarms during November, copy of same on file. He reminded the members once again of the weather ahead and cautioned everyone to be extremely careful.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

Seasons greetings and invitation to attend a meeting Jan 12, 1967, was received from Perinton Ambulance Corps.

The treas. report was read showing receipts of \$ 546.03, Disbursements of \$740.90 leaving a balance of \$ 419.16 in cash, \$ 6,000.00 in Loan Assoc. \$5126.24 in Security Trust Int. Acct. Motion by C. Stewart 2nd by J. Ellis to accept the treas. report as read. Motion carried.

Due to the fact that the meeting is so early in the month, there was a motion by R. Clement 2nd by J. Freyn that the Treas. be empowered to pay the necessary incoming bills. Motion carried.

Vice President Henry Broomfield reported on the Xmas baskets, stating that there were four baskets distributed and some shoes and rubbers to those needing them. Hank also stated that there was one basket for a sick member.

Henry also reported that ~~the~~ he had contacted the VFW and Am. Legion and they will work with the Fire Dept. in planning the 4th of July parade. Hank said he had asked Jack Kenney and will ask some more fellows to help in this matter. Hank asked for a ruling about prize money.

Motion by D. Venton 2nd by J. Erbland that the Fire Dept. will, if necessary underwrite \$1200.00 for the 4th of July parade for prizes for Fire Companies and associated units, and to give the committee authority to use the money as they see fit. Motion carried.

J. Aparo asked if it was the understanding that the Dept. would stand all the expense of the Pig Roast, he was told it is to be a Fire Dept. venture and so we will have to stand the expense of this and hope to turn it into a profit.

V. Lawler reported that Butch Santillo was now home, and that Ted. Phillips was recuperating. Vin. stated that he could no longer get fruit baskets in town and that he would have to decide on other type of gift for sick members.

H. Broomfield spoke about the Bowling Tournament, H. Van Dorpe moved, 2nd by F. Vincent that the treas. be authorized to pay entry fee of \$ 55.00 to the teams taking part in this tournament. Motion carried.

Pres. Chas. Beck stated that the new Jackets would be ready in about six weeks

R. Keenan said that there would be some bids, on Fire Hall remodeling, ready for the Village Board meeting.

Secretary Hare cautioned the members about Aluminum siding now being used in home construction and also read an article from Volunteer Fireman about Tetanus shots. Cal. Stewart reported that the next Chief's meeting would have a discussion about Aluminum siding and we hope many of the fellows will attend.

Vice President Henry Broomfield speaking for his own Company, stated that most of the Companies in the Fairport Fire Dept. were mighty low in their treas. department and that there was not too much of a chance to impliment or increase these treas. without running in opposition with the Dept. Hank thought the three Companies should get together and try to arrive at some means of securing the added funds so that the Companies could afford at least one banquet a year with all expensed coming from the Company Treas. and not have to be paid by the member President Chas. Beck asked the President and the treas. of each company to plan to meet with the executive members of the Dept. in the near future and see if some plan could be worked out.

Chief Ivan Masclee reported that there were 12 alarms during December, a copy on file. Ivan said that there were 119 calls during 1966. Twenty of these were Mutual Aid, 13 calls were emergency and 8 were false alarms. Ivan thanked themen for their help ~~and~~ during the past year and hoped that it would continue this coming year.

Motion by Jack Kenney 2nd by J. Fitzgerald that the Dept. send the Chief's, Line Officers, President and all Past Chiefs that are Active to the 3rd. Batt. dinner, this includes wives or guest. Motion carried.

In regards to the request for donation to NCNYVFA. it was pointed out that last year a donation was made but no name appeared in the Book. This matter is to be checked into.

The treas. report was read showing receipts of \$ 75.30 leaving a balance of \$ in cash, \$ 6000.00 in Loan Assoc. and \$ In Security Trust interest account. Motion by R. Schrader 2nd by Wm. Rich to accept the treas. report as read. Motion Carried.

Jack Kenney reported that he had send out 149 invitations to Fire Depts for the 4th of July parade. Jack gave an outline of parade as forming on Park A-B- possibly using East Ave. and not have the fellows climb up Whitney Road. Jack said he hopes this will meet with the approval of the Village committee.

Jim. Wilson, President of the Hook & Ladder Co. spoke about the meeting with the other Company Presidents and Dept. Officers as was requested by Pres. Charles Beck regarding the possibility of getting more money from the Dept. for the individual companies. The final tabulation as a result of this meeting according to Jim, and all other officers agreed that the sum of \$ 250.00 be paid to each Company, this sum to come from the Annual Fund Drive each year. Jim. covered this matter very thoroughly.

Motion by J. Wilson 2nd by R. Schrader that the Dept. pay the sum of \$ 250.00 to each Company, Hooks-Hose & Protects. each year from the proceeds of the Fund Drive, to be paid by the 1st of June if possible or as soon as permissible

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following the Drive. Motion carried.

Les. Crane gave a short talk on expenses incurred during the recent State Convention in Rochester, which the County still cleared money on, also gave a run down on Fire and Ambulance calls in 1966.

Vincent Kennelley, Jr. spoke on doing over our meeting hall, advised us not to do anything at the present time. The proposed new Town and Village Hall is coming to a head real soon, either we will have it or we wont. It all depends on what the Town's plans are, if they plan to remain with us in Fairport, chances are that we will have a new Fire Hall. He also understands that we want a new Snorkle or pumper but that presently we do not have the room. The next two months should tell us how things are going and than we can go from there. Lets say by April. Thanks to Col Kennelley for this explanation.

2nd Asst. Chief Red. Newman asked Jack Kenney about the talked about telephone alarm system. Jack explained it- for 120 phones it would cost \$ 350.00 per month to operate. The installation charge would be \$8000.00. Jack gave a very thorough explanation of the set up, which I could not follow and get down on the minutes (Cal)

Red. Newman also asked about the PLECTON Radios, Vin. Kennelley said money could be transferred from Rolling Equipment to Radios, if the Department wished, to purchase more radios.

Cal. Stewart, giving a word of advice asked the members to hold up on the purchase of the Plecton radios, as the county was having some problems with them at this time and thought we should wait till the situation was cleared up.

We were informed that the new Jackets would be ready for fitting about Feb. 27th (we hope) President Beck HOT after Forman Staff.

Motion by Vin. Kennelley, Jr. ~~###~~ 2nd by Wm. Rich that the boys, members of the Dept. now in service be permitted to purchase these Jackets, at the same price now being paid by the members, when they return from the service. Motion carried.

Chief Mascles reported that there were 6 alarms during January, very lucky.

Mayor Knapp reported that there was a new compressor on the Fire Alarm Tank, the old one having burned out.

Letter from Chris Chiodo stating the requirements of group needed for color guard.

Motion by R. Schrader 2nd by J. Schrader that the Dept. drop the proposition for a color guard as explained by Chris Chiodo. Motion carried.

The Dept. received a letter from NCVFA, explaining the mix up about last years Ad. in the year book. Motion by J. Fitzgerald 2nd by H. Barbierer to take a half page Ad. in this years YEAR BOOK. Motion carried.

The treas. report was read showing receipts of \$ 2780.00, disbursements of \$1391.00 leaving a balance of \$ 1465.77 in cash, \$6000.00 in Loan Assoc. and \$3126.24 in the Interest Acct. at Security Trust Co. Motion by J. Fitzgerald 2nd by J. Wilson to accept the treas. report as read. Motion carried.

Jack Kenney stated that the invitations had been sent out for the 4th of July Parade and a few answers were received. Things moving along fairly well.

R. Keenan reported that the Fund Drive was progressing and that things should be in shape to go. Dick said he had reserved a shelter for June 4th. at Powder Mill Park for the participants of the Fund Drive.

John Freyn explained to the Dept. that we could hire the Rancher's for \$135.00 per parade in county, Mor out of County, and they could not be here Decoration day We can hire the Alpine Girls for \$ 125.00 per parade in county and \$ 150.00 out of County and they will not contract for any others when it falls on our dates. Both of these outfits would have to have more if we attend the State Convention.

There was quite a bit of discussion on this subject and due to the fact that the Rancher's are so far from here (Nunda) there was a motion by R. Jensen 2nd by H. Barbierer to contract the Alpine Girls for the coming season. Carried.

Chief Masclee reported that there were 8 alarms during February, including 2 Mutual Aid runs. One to East Roch and the other to Webster.

Regular and Annual meeting of the Fairport Fire Department was called to order in the Fire Hall at 8:10PM. by President Charles Beck.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read to the Dept., there being no corrections the minutes were approved as read.

The treas. annual report was read showing receipts of \$19,416.83, disbursements of \$18,252.97 leaving a balance of \$6,000.00 in Loan Assoc. \$3,173.51 in Security Trust interest acct. and \$1,465.77 in cash. (copy on file)

Motion by G. Becker 2nd by J. Zimmer to accept the treas. report as read.
Motion carried.

Bills totaling \$206.00 were read to the Dept. Motion by E. Schutt 2nd by Hilton Dryer to pay these bills. Motion carried.

The following communications were read to the Dept.

Letter from NCNYVFA returning check for Add in year book, as it was too late for book and suggesting that we take Add in Newark Program.

Motion by John Fitzgerald that the Dept. take the Add in the Newark Fire Dept. Program Book. Motion carried. (Newark hosting the NCNYVFA convention)

Jack Kenney reported that the 4th of July Parade might be reversed and start off West Church St. and end up on Whitney Road. (Vets. might hold carnival)
Jack stated that the use of the American Can parking lot might be sought to park the visiting Firemen's Trucks, Jack also stated that there might be a Soft Pitch league this summer in conjunction with the recreation comm. and that the Fire Dept. would enter this and that coverage in insurance might be needed.

It was reported that Paul Smith was coming along fine after his operation.

Vice President H. Broomfield stated that if the Dept. did not send Wm and Mrs Rich to the dedication of Firemen's Home that the Hook & Ladder Co would.
Motion by J. Fitzgerald 2nd by Wm. Motion by John Fitzgerald 2nd by Ed. Nelson that letters be sent to Constitutional Convention representatives reminding them to bear in mind the Volunteer Firemen in their actions. Motion Carried.

The next order of business was election of Officers- Delegates and Alternates. President Beck appointed Wm. Hartigan and F. Peck as tellers and the Dept. the nominations were declared open.

Thanks and continued support for new officers were given by outgoing President Chas. Beck and Chief Ivan Masclee.

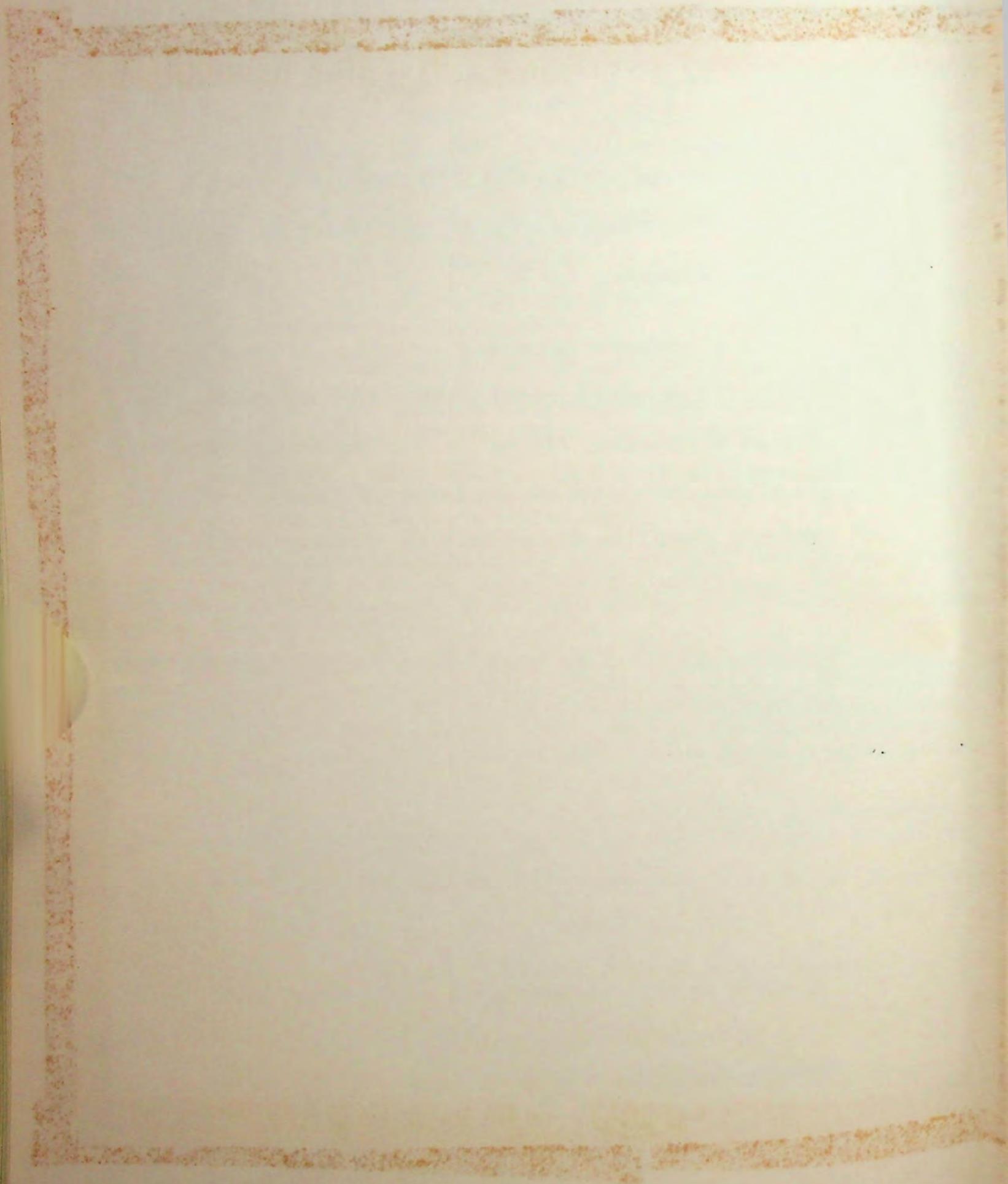

THIS LETTER IS TO BE INCLUDED IN THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING.

Gentlemen, I would appreciate your indulgence for a few minutes in which time I will bring to your attention some problems of this department that I am deeply concerned about and effects all of us. It is apparent that very little has been accomplished towards resolving these problems.

It is very disturbing and unfortunate that our Chief Officers lack the interest to follow through with their obligations and responsibilities to the men of this department and also to the community.

We have talked for several months about building a new fire station and the purchase of a new piece of fire equipment, to the best of my knowledge we have accomplished nothing. We have also had discussions from time to time with regards to creating a single fire department and eliminating the three companies. This I personally feel has a lot of merit in that we could become much more efficient, more than what we are presentley. I do not know how many of you men are familiar with construction and equipment cost, but everyday we do nothing; the cost of labor goes up, the cost of material increases and also the interest rates on monies borrowed may very well rise. What I am trying to say, Gentlemen, is that this is supposed to be an organization whose obligation is to the community and unless we get off our dead butts, we won't even have an organization.

Thank you for your time. In closing I would like to make three motions, so that we do not delay any longer and at least get the wheels of progress in motion:

1st - I will make the motion that Burt Ross be made chairman of the Building Committee, to organize a group of men to meet with the Village Board and the architect for the purpose of drawing up plans for a new fire station to be erected at the intersections of Whitney Rd. and East St.

2nd - I will make the motion that Bob Brown be made chairman of the equipment committee to draw up specifications for the purchase of a new fire apparatus.

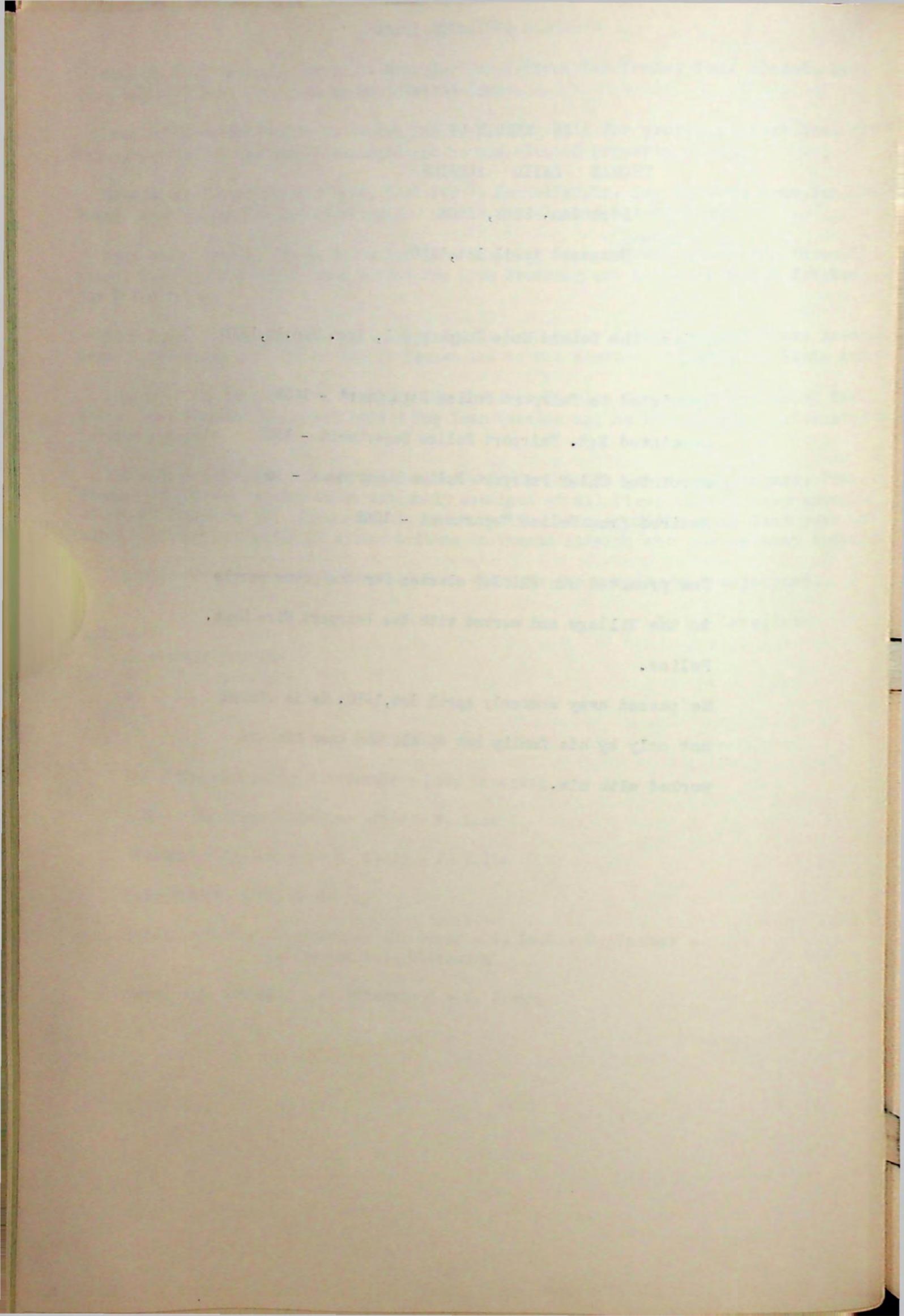

"CAL" was a true FIREMAN in every sense of the word, completely "DEDICATED". He held all line offices in the DeLAND HOSE COMPANY #1, INC. PRESIDENT of the FAIRPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT and he was a CHIEF of the FAIRPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT from April, 1940 thru March, 1965.

"CAL" was not only a Fairport Fireman but was loved and respected by all FIRE DEPARTMENTS and on January, 1965 "CAL" was appointed as MONROE COUNTY CO-ORDINATOR, a post he held till his death.

"CAL's" popularity and dedication was shown by his fellow men by them requesting the Village Board to name the new Fire Hall on the North side to STEWART STATION and we were so happy that "CAL" was able to take part in the "STEWART STATION" dedication, after which Louise (Mrs. Stewart) had OPEN HOUSE for hundreds of "CAL's" friends.

Found topmost amongst "CAL's" papers was the following Verse which was truly "CAL's" way of living.

LET ME GIVE

I do not know how long I'll live, but while I live
Lord let me ^{give} some comfort to some one in need and
let me do whatever I can to ease things for my
fellow man.

I want naught but to do my part, to lift a tired
weary heart, to change folk's frowns to smiles again.

"CAL" STEWART PASSES AWAY



CLAIR E. "CAL" STEWART, 64, of 2 Lewis St., Fairport, New York, Monroe County's second Mutual Aid Co-ordinator and Chief of the Monroe County Fire Bureau, died September 17, 1972 of a heart attack.

Chief Stewart became Fire Co-ordinator on January 1, 1965, succeeding the late Ambrose E. Foss.

Under the Mutual Aid System Chief Stewart supervised 4,000 Volunteer Firemen in 43 Fire Departments in 19 towns. He also supervised 25 experienced City of Rochester Firemen who conducted Training Classes for Volunteer Firemen in the Rochester Fire and Police Academy.

He became a member of the Fairport Fire Department in 1926 and was serving his 8th year as Fairport Chief when named to the County post. In 1969 he was elected President of the Monroe County Volunteer Fire Chiefs Association and had served for 10 years as a Director of the Monroe County Volunteer Firemen's Association.

He was a member of the N. Y. Fire Chief's Association; Firemen's Association of the State of New York; The International A-

sociation of Fire Chiefs; Eastern Fire Chiefs; Monroe County Chiefs; Monroe County Firemen's Association and the Northern Central V. F. A.

Henry MacGregor, President of the Monroe County V.F.A., said "Cal Stewart was a very conscientious man; he knew most of the 4,000 Volunteer Firemen in our County by their first names and was very popular. He worked long hours for several years. The Fire Service will surely miss him."

Many Fire Companies in Monroe and neighboring Counties have donated to the Recreation Fund "Operation Small Change" at the FIREMEN'S HOME in his memory.

There was some discussion about the Fairport Junior Fire Dept. It was explained that this was a group of youngsters about 10-11 years old who lived in the area of Stewart Hall. The only problem was that the Dept. wanted to go on record that this was not a sponsored action of the Dept. but that it was only a group of youngsters playing Firemen, it was thought that it would soon die out with school starting and winter coming on. The fellows did not want to clamp down on the kids but did not plan to encourage this group.

There was some discussion about sending some money to Father Schmidt in Coring, Motion by H. VanDorpe 2nd by J. Molick to donate \$1000.00 to Father Schmidt Motion carried. Father Schmidt was former Chaplain and active member of the Fairport Fire Dept. so all agreed that this gift was not out of line.

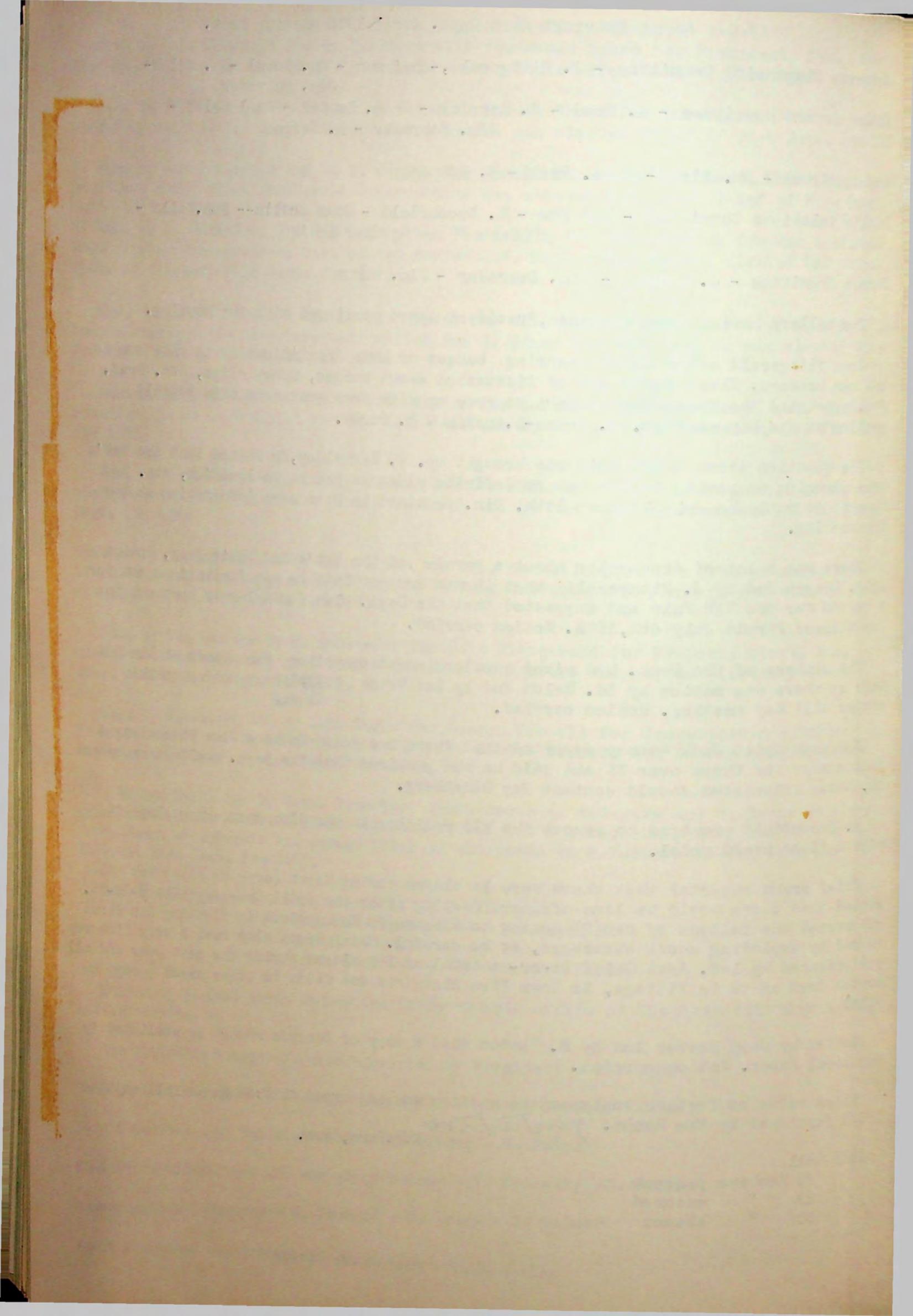

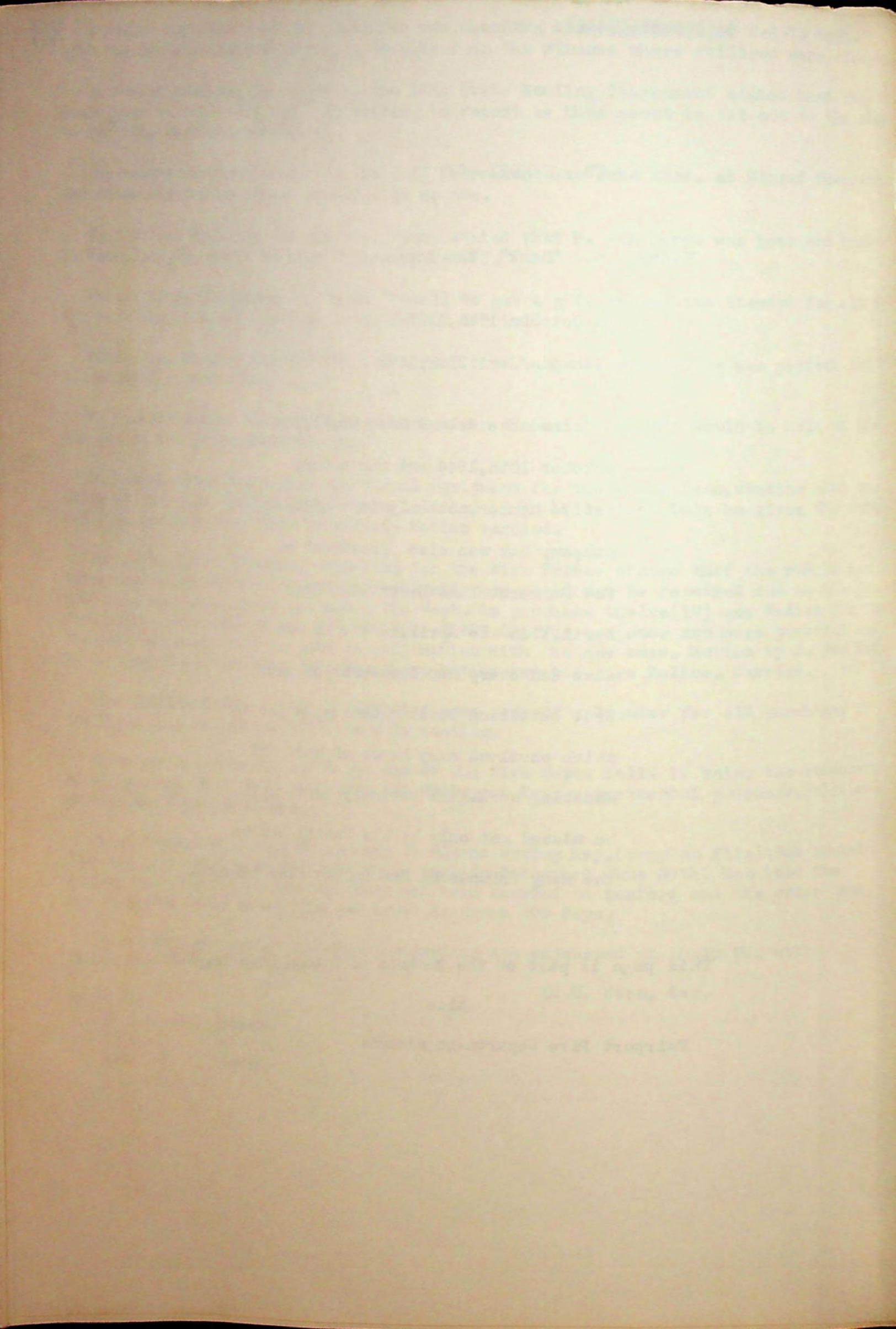

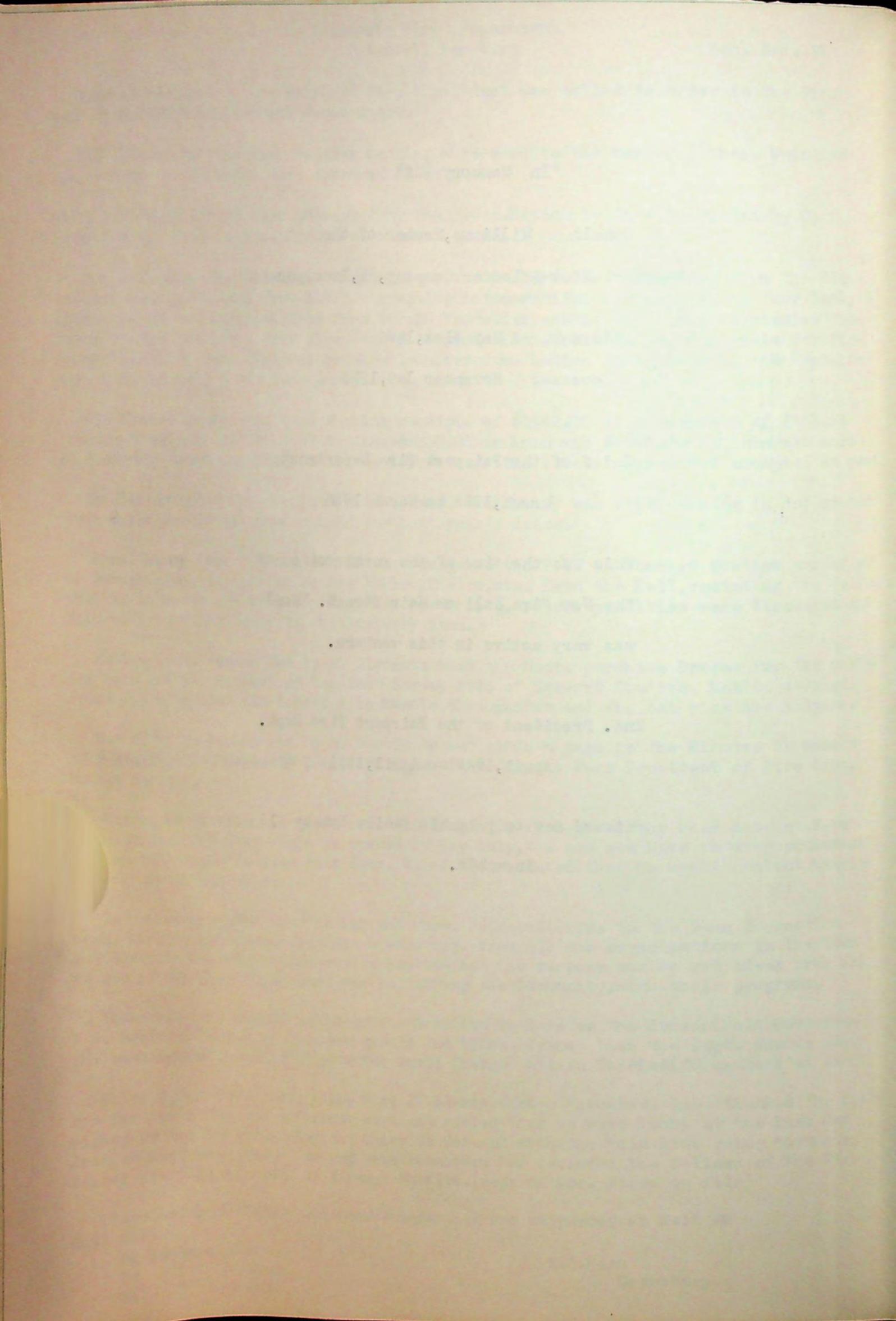

Many Fire Companies from all areas spent untold hours at this flood caused by a break in the bot-tom of the Canal and letting loose a flood of millions of gallons of Water,fortunately no lives were lost but the damage was unbelievable.

Geo. Walters stated that the first order for the new jackets should be received about the middle of December, the next order about three or four weeks later.

Chief Brown reported that there were 32 alarms during October - 7 code 3's -several f Mut. aids- and many grass & leaf calls. Bob also stated that the residents of Bushnell's Basin are all so appreciative of all the help given to them in their disaster. Bob also warned the fellows that the Pump on the Grass Fire Truck shpuld not be operating unless there was water being pumped thru it.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 9:30 PM.

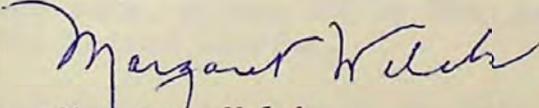

R. Conant speaking about the Legislative meeting held in Albany Oct. 30 & 31st. 1976. there were many bills defeated and some passed and others to have further action taken before being acted on. There was much discussion at this event as to what determined an Emergency, this was in regards to pumping out cellars, entering homes when residents were absent and many other items, Blue light is identification and does not give one the right to speed, or pass Red lights, Fire Police have to be careful in passing men thru to fires, etc.

Motion by John Fitzgerald 2nd by Stan Austin to set aside a Page for Lynn Bruening a former President of the Fairport Fire Dept. who passed away suddenly, Oct. 5th, 1976 Motion carried.

Chief Doser reported that there were 29 Alarms during October and thanked the fellows for their usual fine work. Gerry also reminded the fellows about parking their cars at fires, not to get them in peoples yards, nor too close to the Fire in case extra equipment was needed. He also warned the men about driving too fast and to be sure to respect the red lights, as the Dept. could not help them if they were arrested.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned after Chaplain Chittenden told of the close call Vin. Kemmelley, Jr and Noreen Had in Auto Accident Saturday night Oct 30th, 1976, stating that just seconds were between their possible fatal and their fortunate escape with only bruises. The Chaplain asked for a moments silence for Lynn and the Lords blessing on the members. Meeting adjourned at 9:45PM

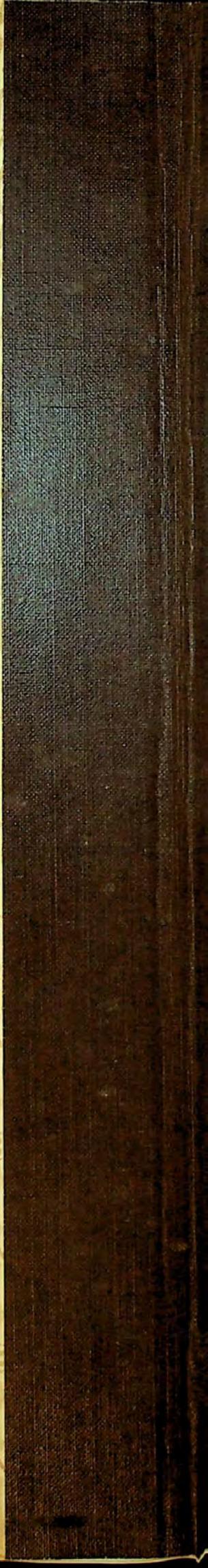
