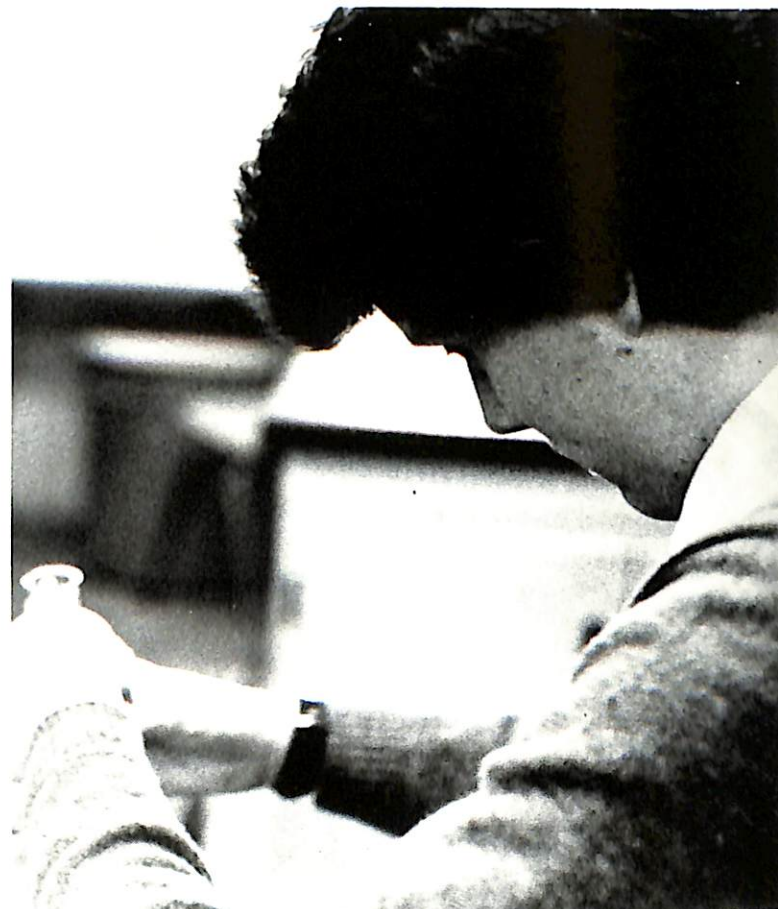

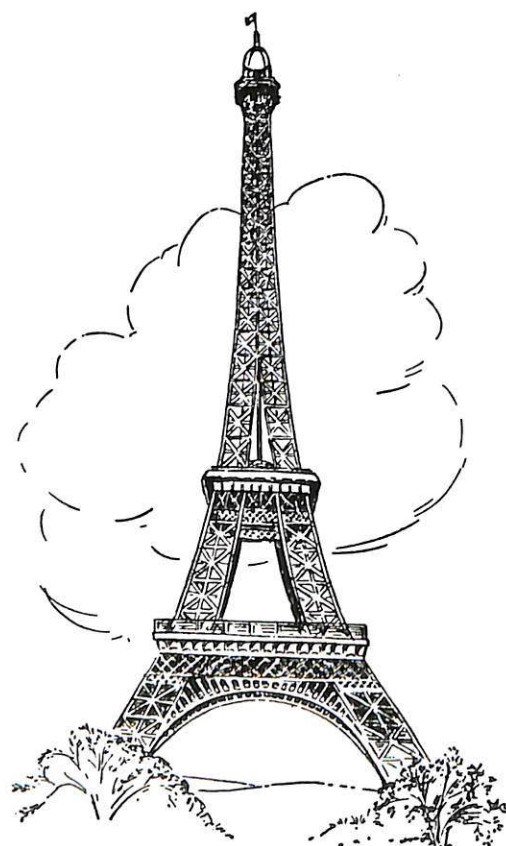

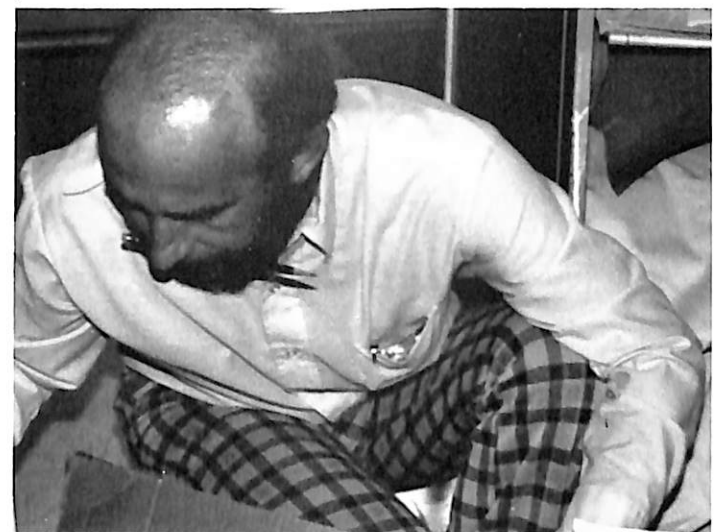

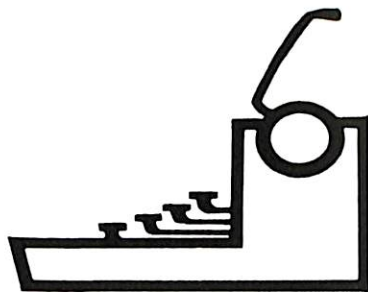

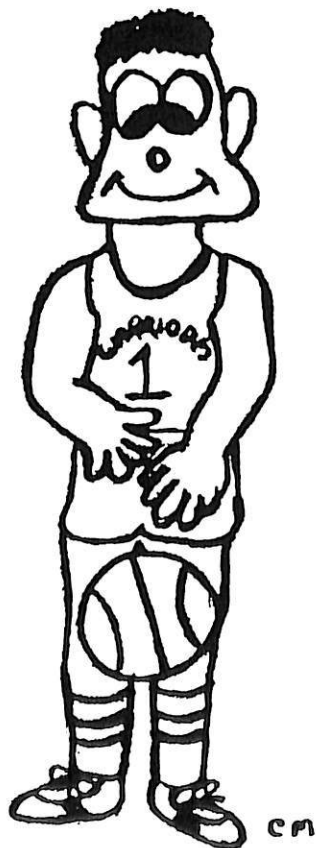
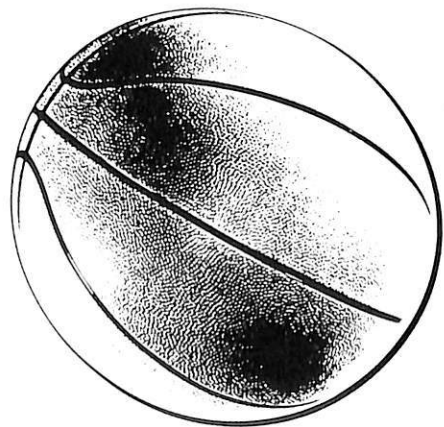
The team will be losing eight seniors, but we know that the boys will be back with the Warrior spirit fighting to defend their record next year.
