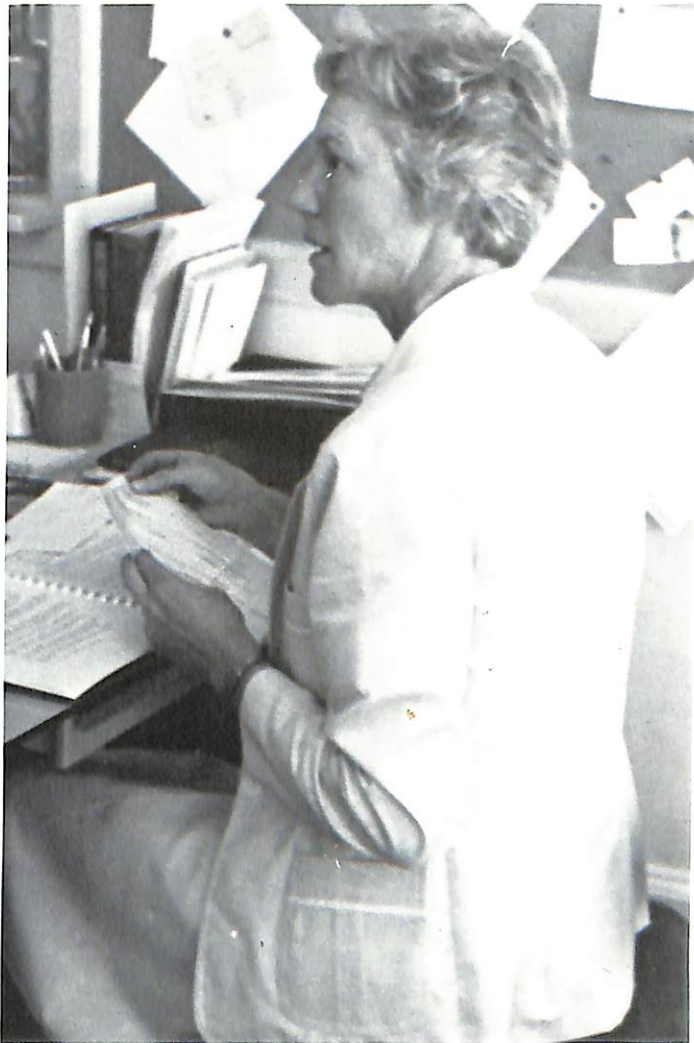

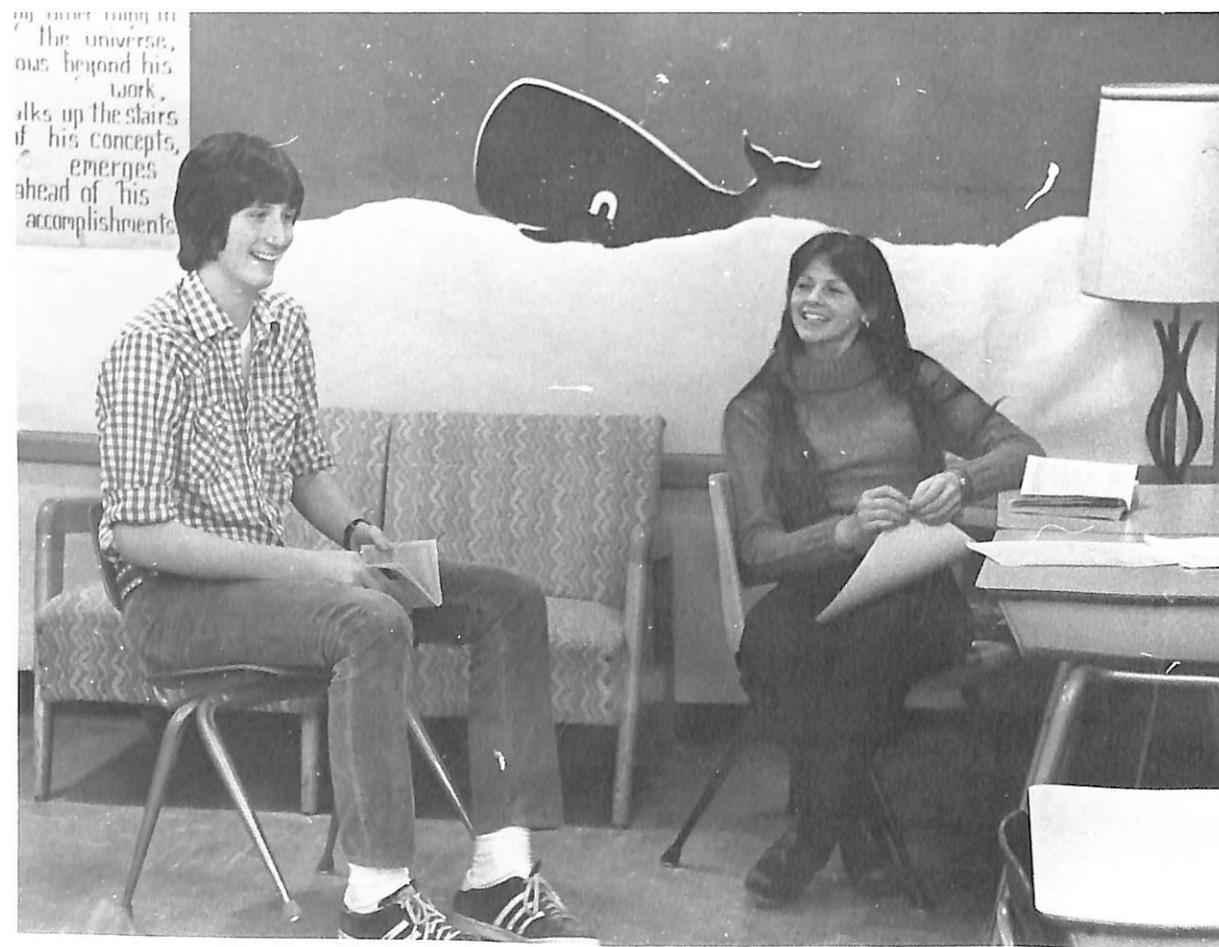

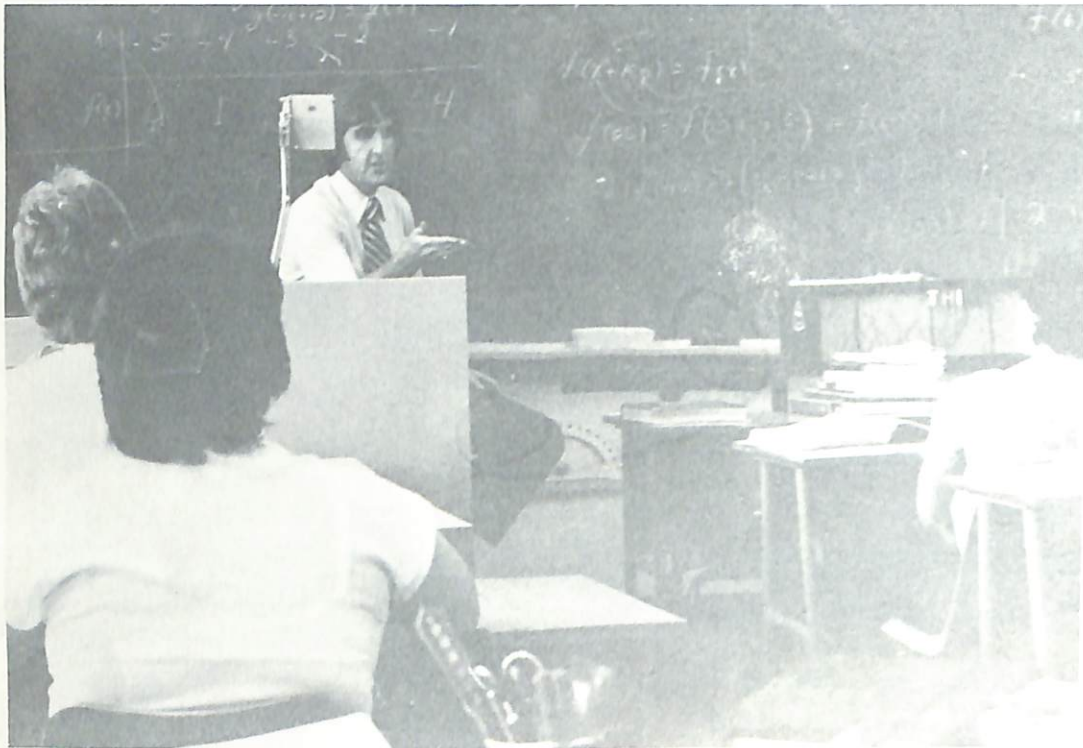

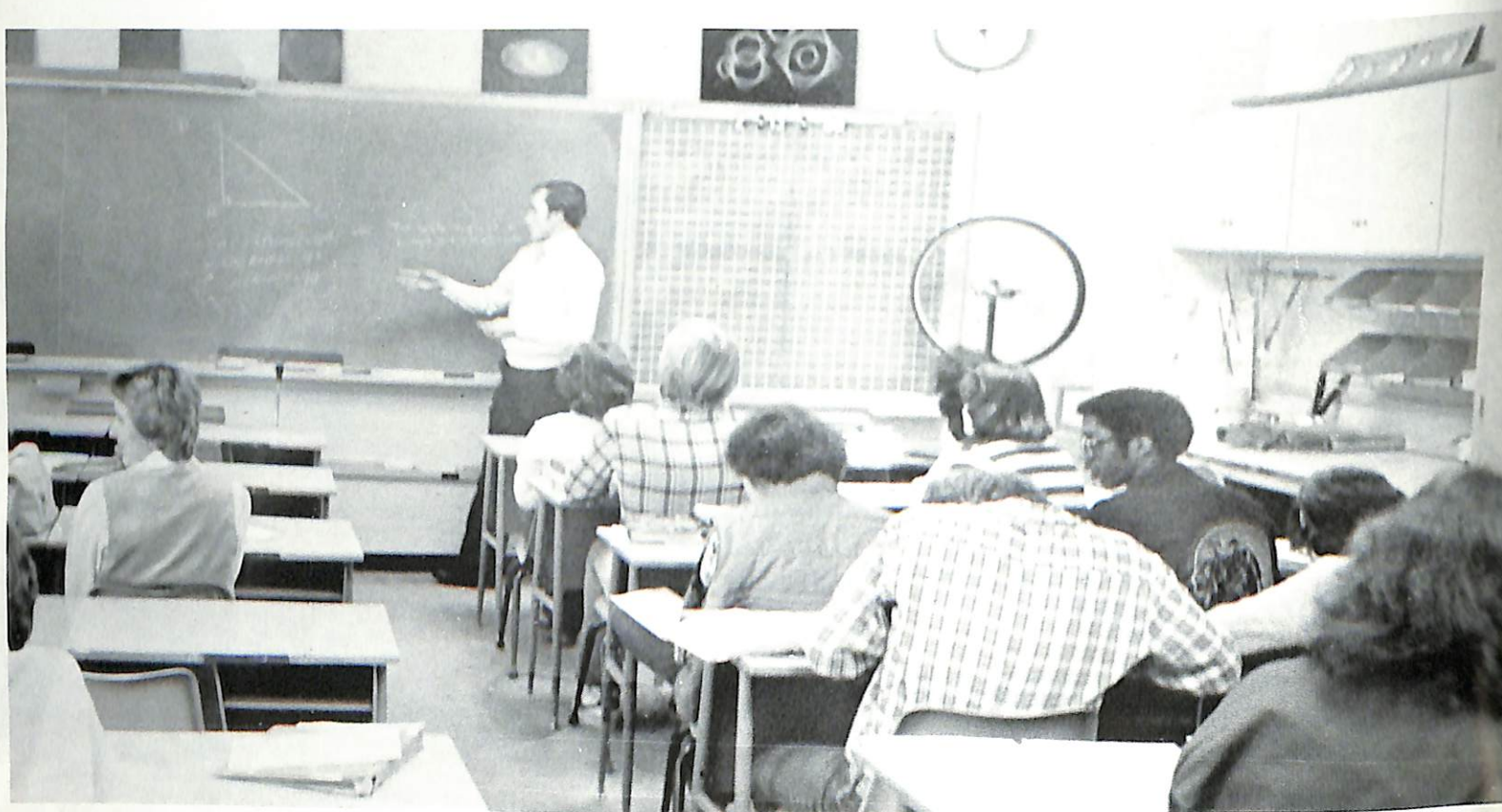

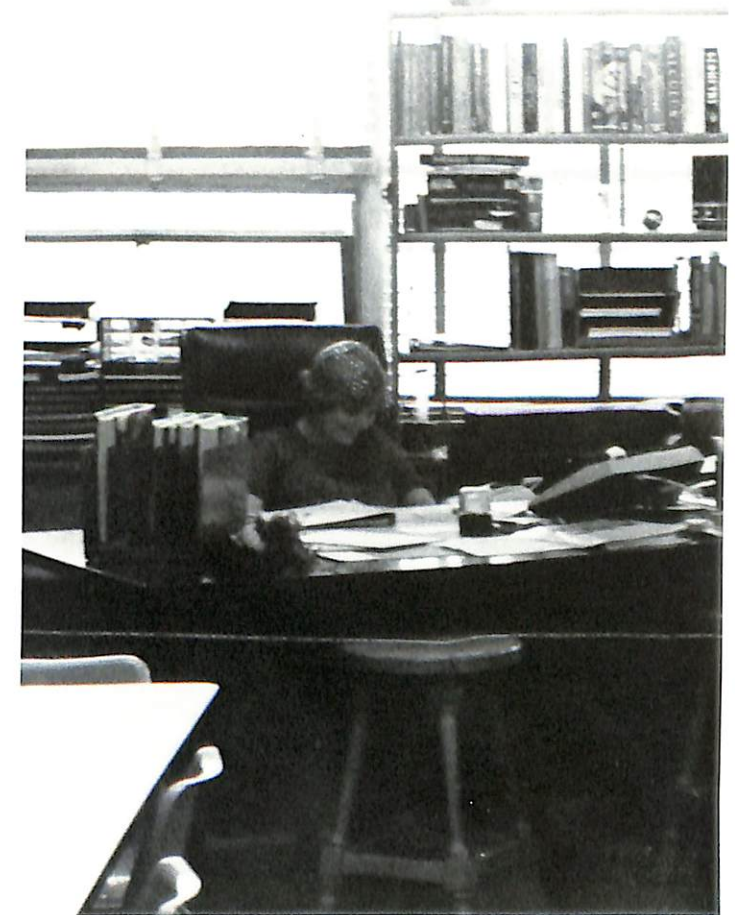

This year, eleven seniors were chosen to attend "A Presidential Classroom for Young Americans" in Washington, D.C. The program concentrated on providing the students with information concerning our government's problems, policies, and processes. Seven one-week classes were scheduled during the program. Each class was divided into ten sections of 39 to 42 students per section.

During the seminars, the National Student Body visited the various religious facilities around the city, toured the White House and Capitol Hill, met with representatives, visited the Central Intelligence Agency, Langley Center, and toured the Smithsonian Buildings. The first three classes visited the Kennedy Center for a night at the theater. The students chose to see one of the following productions: "West Side Story," "Clothes for a Summer Hotel," or a concert by the National Symphony Orchestra. The next four classes visited the Hayloft, a dinner theatre, where the students watched a production of Agatha Christie's, "A Spider's Web."

Although their weeks in Washington were intense and somewhat tiring, the students gained knowledge and new friends through their experiences.

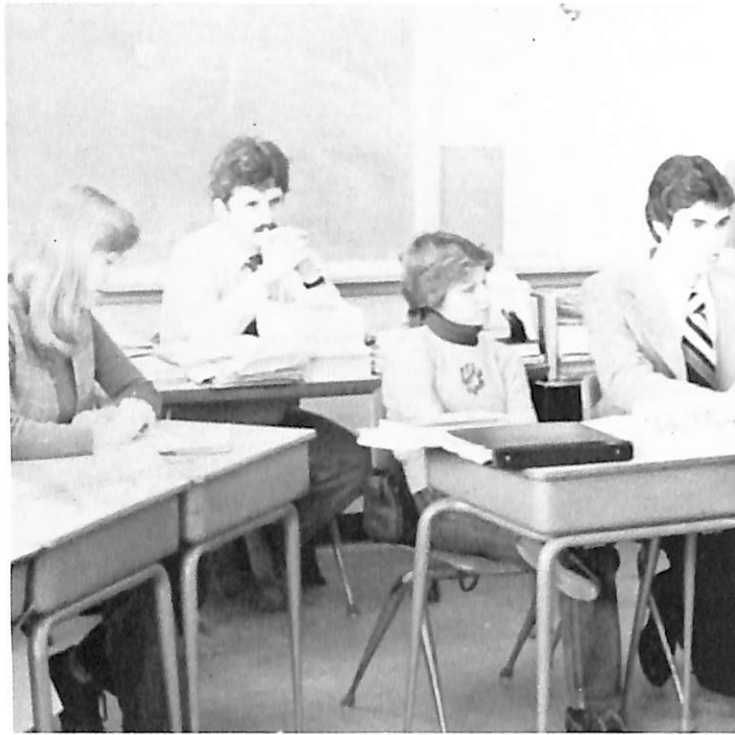

As was the case last year, the P.A.G. classes, under the direction of Mr. Covington, staged a "drug-bust" simulation. Narcs in the three classes attempted to develop cases from evidence gathered in order to bring the sellers to court. The judges in the three classes were Edgar Green, Paul Richardson, and Sharon Taylor.

Evidence against Ronnie Sample was suppressed due to violation of the chain of custody. Second period's defendant, Poul Sorensen, was found guilty of possession and possession with the intent to sell. The defense argued that the chain of custody had been violated here also,

but Judge Richardson did not accept their plea. In fourth period's trials, Lisa Malloy and Chris Gebo were acquitted while Teresa Miller and Tim Darcy, fellow Narcs, were charged with entrapment. The students thought it was an interesting experience.

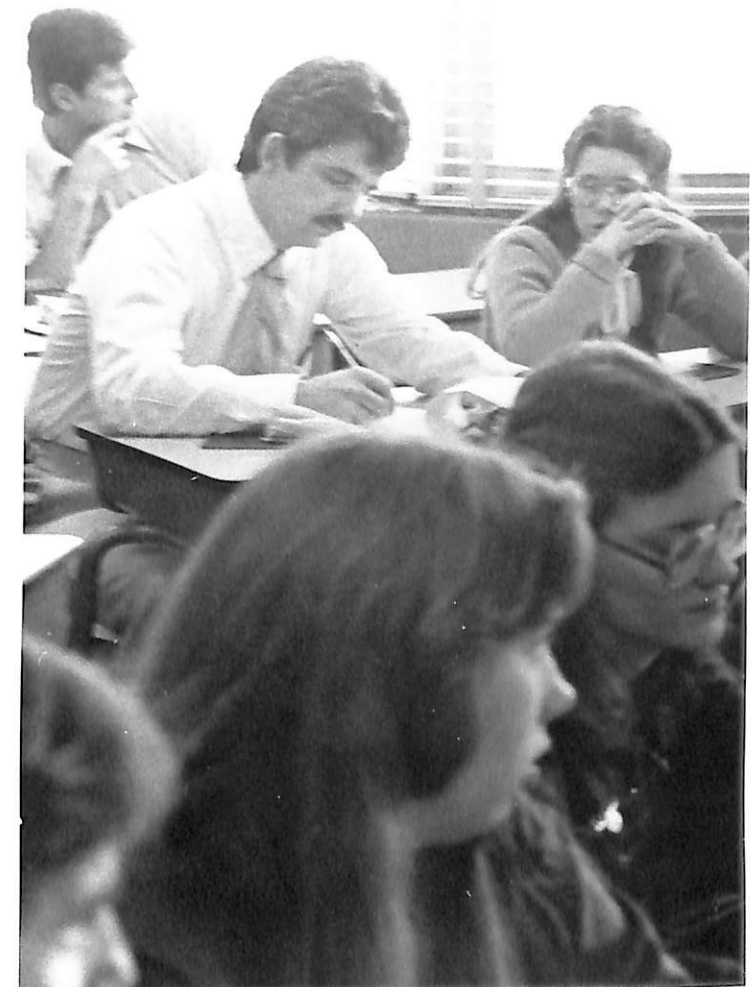

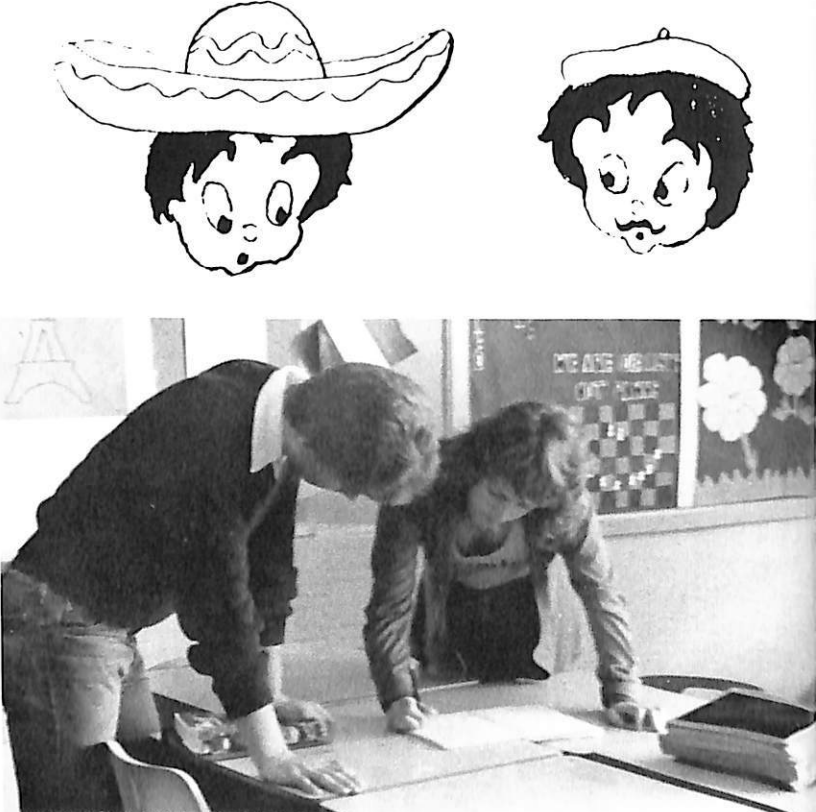

graders. Consumer Education, Family Life and Parenthood Education, Clothing and Textiles, and Foods and Nutrition are the topics considered during the course.

Home Economics II involves tenth grade students who have completed the first level

course. A Home Management and Housing unit is added to the previous curriculum.

Home Economics III includes the above units along with a section titled Child Development. This course builds on the skills and knowledge gained from previous course listings.

Home Economics IV concentrates on advanced skills and applications of knowledge and careers found in the preceding units. It synthesizes all information into solving special need diets, gourmet foods, and the preservation of foods.

# building a career through industrial arts

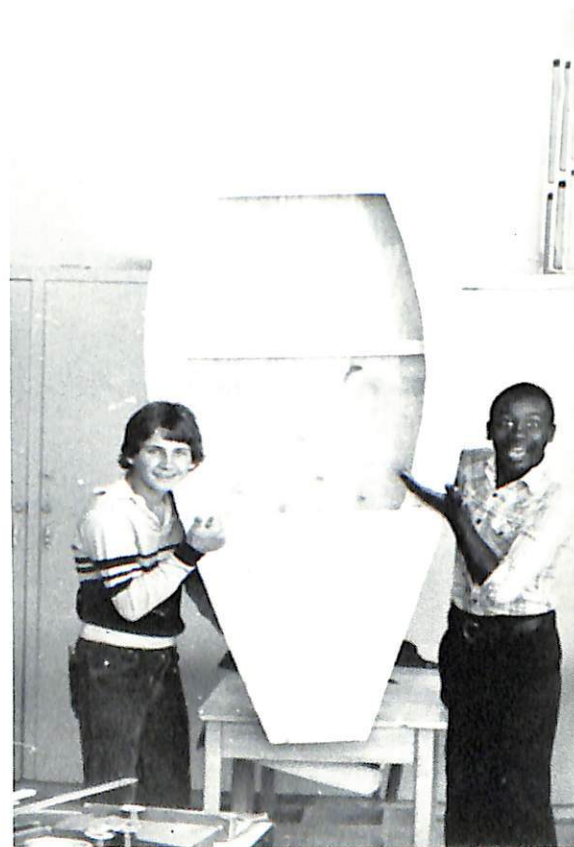

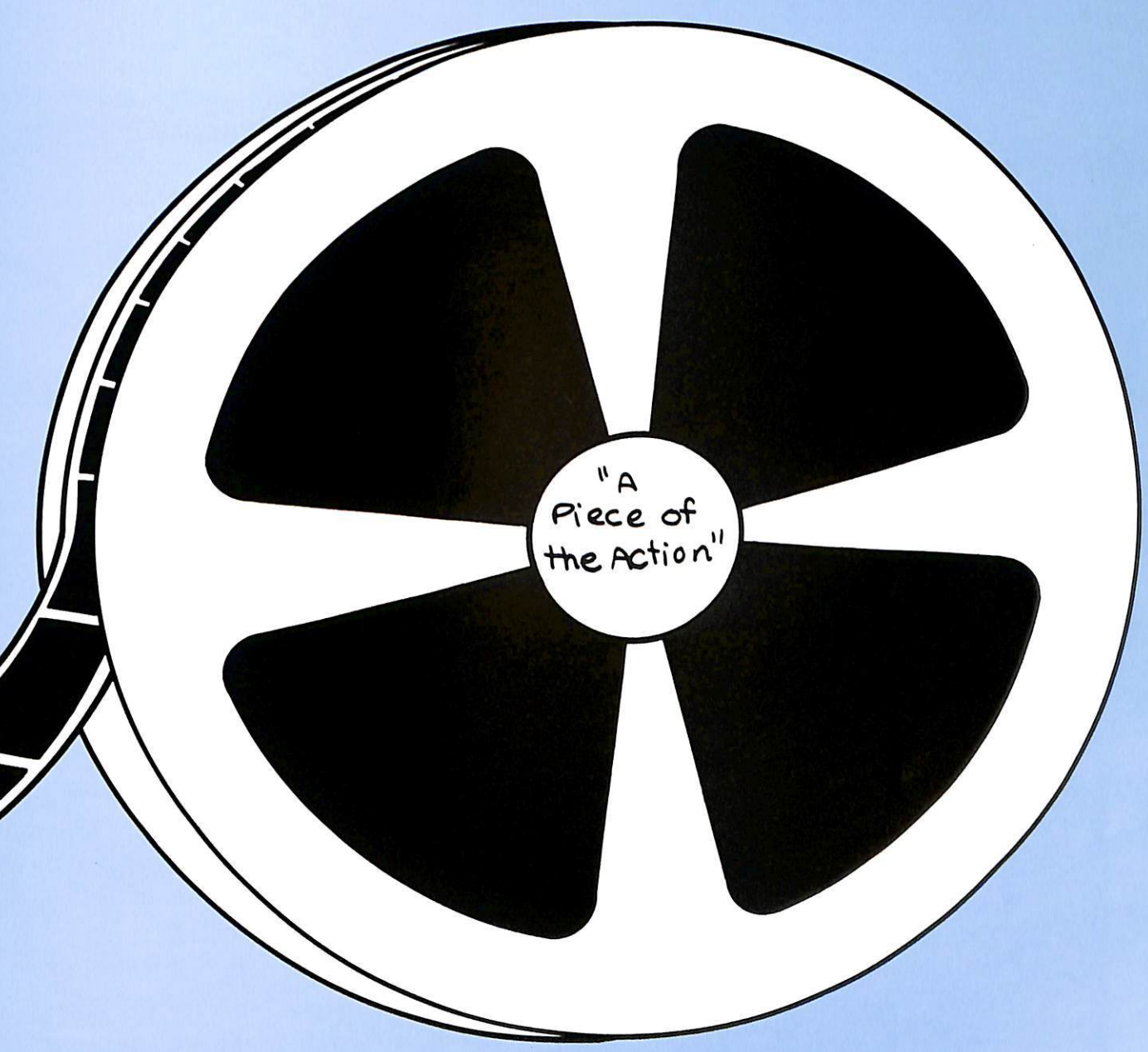

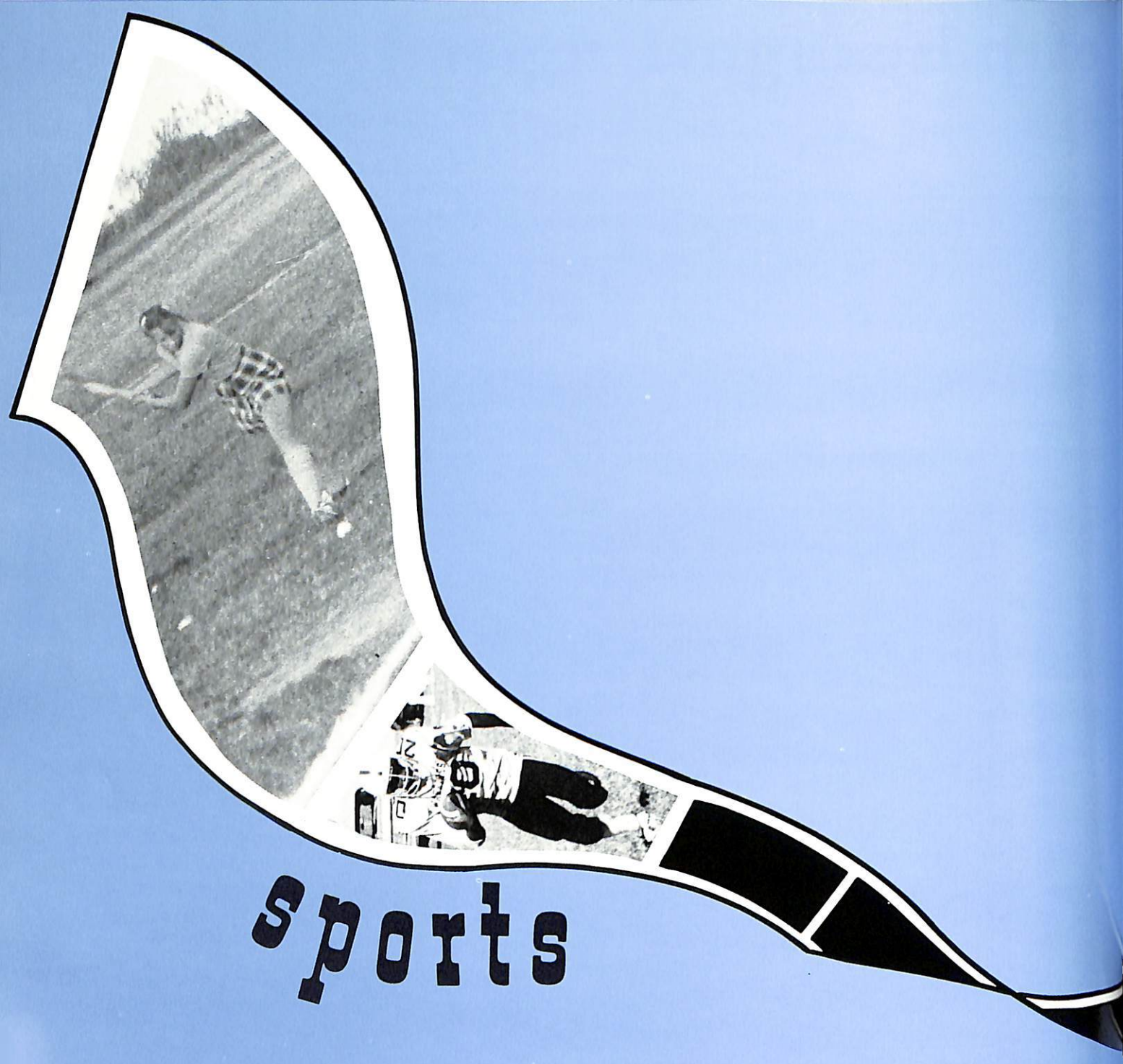

The students who went on the shorter trip to Canada also had an exciting time. They visited the cities of Montreal and Quebec.

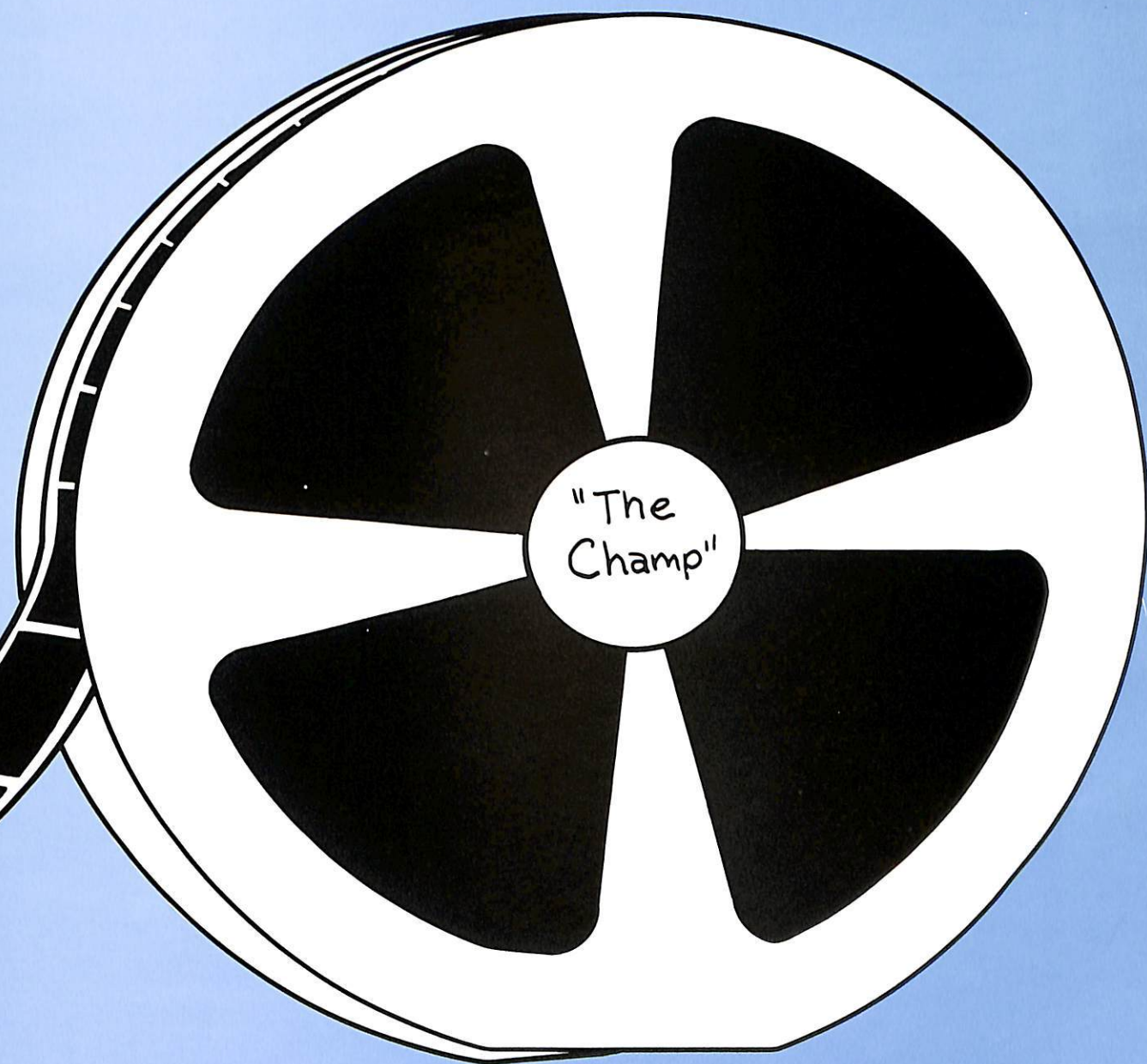
While in Montreal, the students visited the site of the 1976 Olympics and toured old Montreal by bus. They also had time to shop in downtown Montreal.

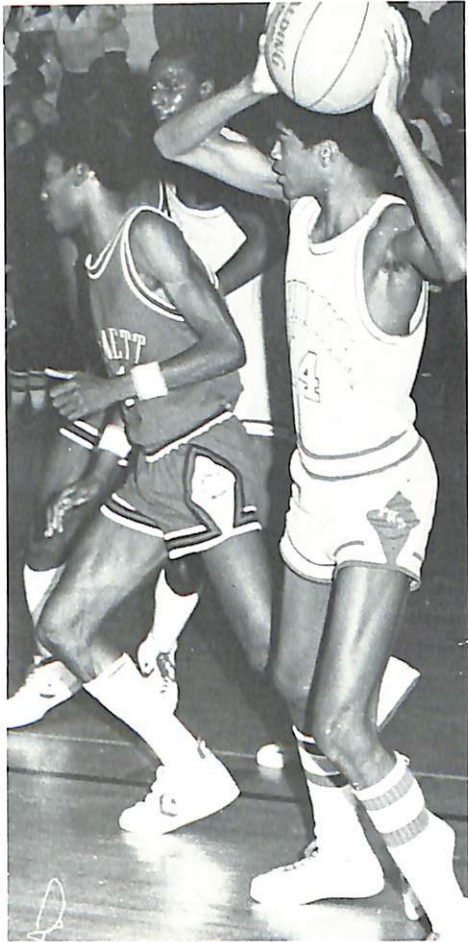
