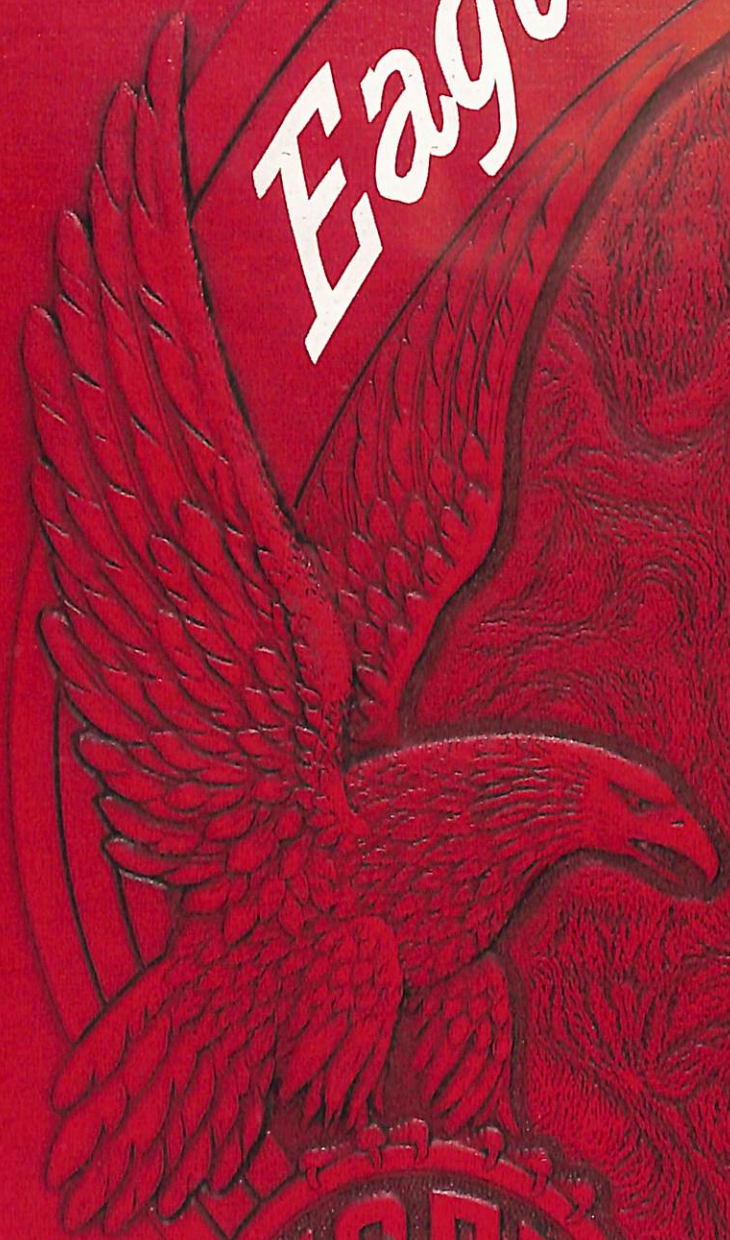


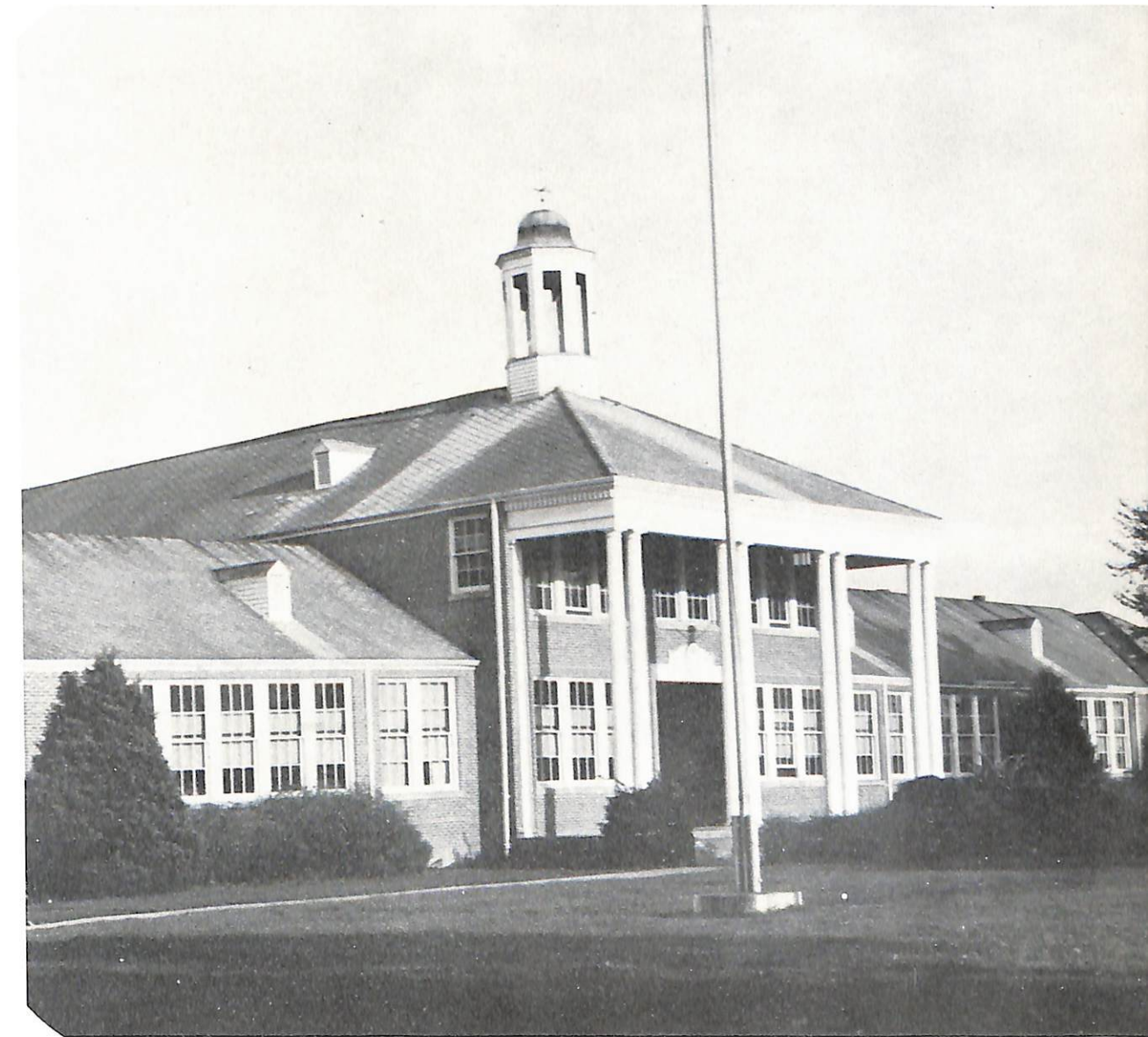

PATRONS.....whose interest and loyal support have helped make this yearbook possible

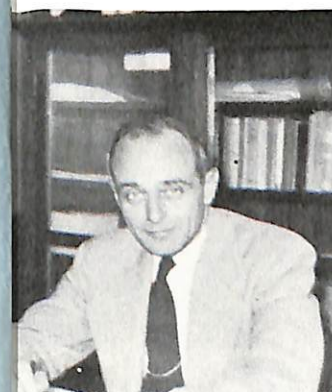

CLASS HISTORY

THE FIRST SIX YEARS of our formal education in various elementary schools of Worcester County included the usual little things that we all can remember: the excitement of the first day . . . meeting new playmates . . . learning to print our names . . . learning to read and write the words in our tiny vocabulary . . . running, skipping . . . playing big bad wolf at recess . . . our love for story-time when teacher would read absorbing tales of animals or of little boys and girls our age (Somehow, there was always a happy ending with a little lesson attached!) . . . learning to add and then that more difficult task, to subtract! . . . studying about the children in other lands with different ways of life . . . studying about the Egyptians, the Greeks, the Romans! . . . music class and the songs in the little brown book . . . making things out of wood and clay . . . happily participating in games on the playground . . . learning to do fractions and other more difficult work, indicating that our elementary education was coming to a close . . . and with the passing of little "notes"—a sure sign of educational growth—we soon found ourselves prepared to enter junior high school.

Remember our teachers, Mrs. Elizabeth Shockley and Mr. Francis Olmstead Hewett Metcalf, who were later replaced by Mrs. Minnie Blank and Mr. Chester Sibley, respectively . . . our many interesting studies . . . our "reputation" . . . "Freddie, the Bookworm," the play Mr. Sibley's class wrote and presented to the student body . . . Mr. Sibley's calendars . . . Mrs. Blank's pencil tapping . . . the exit of the Roman pictures . . . the Worcester County Baseball Championship.

OUR FRESHMAN YEAR we had homerooms in Miss Mabel Jones's and Mr. Beauchamp's rooms . . . This was the year of the automobile races in Miss Mabel's room . . . our many petty arguments with Mr. Beauchamp . . . our good production

of the one-act play, "Elmer and the Lovebug" . . . the Worcester County Baseball Championship won by good old S. H. H. S. again this year . . . the Safety Patrol trip to Washington (remember Charley McCarthy and the "endurance" race up and down the Washington Monument) . . . Miss Mabel Jones's music class ("Room quiet").

OUR SOPHOMORE YEAR found us in the homerooms of Mr. Leon Timmons and Mr. George Engle. This was the year we completed by giving the Prom for the seniors. Do you recall the hard work (but at the same time great fun) connected with sponsoring such a gala affair as the Junior-Senior Prom . . . and what a success it was . . . and how closely we followed its theme, a Southern Plantation? Concerning this year, we can remember things like our splendid presentation of the one-act play, "Roughly Speaking," which, incidentally, won honors . . . the school's retention of the baseball crown . . . the memorable patrol trip to Washington.

OUR JUNIOR YEAR in Miss Grace Jones' homeroom will always be remembered as one of our liveliest. Remember the Library Club-Student Council trip to Baltimore in October . . . our presentation of the spine-tingling one-act play of the supernatural, "The Opening of a Door," for which we won praise . . . the Driver Education Program with Mr. Timmons, his ace drivers, and the "Chevy" ("Now miss that mud puddle!") . . . the operetta "Marianne," the main musical event of the year . . . the Music Festival at S. T. We, the Class of 1951, being of sound mind and memory, do hereby make, publish, and declare this our last will and testament in the manner following:

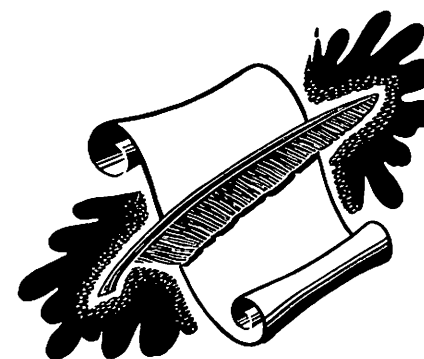
ITEM:
