I find among my old papers, a memorandum
stating that Commissioners acting as Trustees
for Heirs of Doctor Jas. Purnell, settled
agreed amicably with James B. Robin
to settle a boundary on original Spoldon
line. There is an old stone in woods woods
near corner of Mt. Vernon, and on
Southern outlet of Fairfield farm -
opposite the Mc-Alley farm sold by
Inv. R. Purnell, Deeded to him by Jas. B.
Robins and Andasia Robins. E. a. Robins.
