In our senior year, Bill Jewby from Arlington, Va. joined us, making a total of thirty-one in the class.

The class has had twenty-four of its members to withdraw from the roll; these are: Anne Lydon, Terry Blades, Ellen Gay Duncan, Jimmy Snyder, Charles Mason, Ruth Reynolds, Page Huff, Pat Donavan, Carlton Lambertson, Shirley Hillman, Wesley Insley, Evelyn Dryden, Bertie Mae Evans, Fred Scott, Patsy Wilkerson, Raymond Wise, Ida Belle Ward, Joan Weidema, Herbert Martin, Barry Bernstein, Elaine Ewell, Alice Brewer, and Allen Bailey.

We feel that this class history would be incomplete if we did not mention the social events of the last four years. As freshmen, we gave our first dance, called "The Dungaree Dance." As sophomores, cooperating with the juniors and seniors, we gave a Christmas formal. In our junior year we gave several more dances and began to concentrate on our Junior Class Play, a mystery comedy entitled "Finders Creepers," which is believed to be one of the best plays ever presented at P.H.S. The proceeds of the play were used for our prom, called "Moonlight Cruise." As seniors we gave a beautiful Christmas formal.

The climax to our high school days is slowly drawing near. Commencement will soon be here, so we, the Seniors of 1954, bid farewell to our many school friends. As they follow in our footsteps, may they be as happy in their experiences of school life as we have been in ours.


