Witnesseth, That for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred dollars  
current money, by the said James B. Robbins Son to the said  
Thomas A. Spurr and Eleanor his wife - in hand paid, at and before the sealing and delivery  
of these presents, the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge, and themselves to be therewith  
fully satisfied, contented and paid, the said Thomas A. Spurr and Eleanor his wife  
have bargained and sold, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain and sell, alien, enfeoff, release, convey  
and confirm unto the said James B. Robbins Son, his heirs and assigns forever, all  
the right, title, interest and estate of the said Thomas A. Spurr and Eleanor  
W. Spurr his wife, at law or in equity, of in to and out of the following tract  
or parcels of land, lying and being in Worcester County aforesaid, and called and  
known by the names following: - "Caerlaverock", "Moor Hill Landing",  
"Leeds", "Meadow Garden", bounded by the County road leading from Moor  
Hill to Nasawango Bridge, the lands of John Spurr, Justice M. Brattan,  
the Potomac River, and the parish of land at the foot of Moor Hill Bridge,  
belonging to William Moore

together with all and singular the buildings, improvements, ways, waters, water courses, rights, privileges, advantages,  
and appertenances, thereto belonging, or in anywise appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, interest, trust,  
property, claim and demand whatsoever, at law and in equity, of said Thomas A. Spurr and Eleanor  
his wife of, in and to the same tract or parcels of land  
**TO HAVE** and **TO HOLD** the said tract or parcels of land and premises with the  
appertenances thereto, unto the said James B. Robbins Son

his - heirs and assigns, to the only and proper use and behoof of the said James B. Robbins  
Son his heirs and assigns for ever.

AND the said Thomas A. Spence and Eleanor his wife - for themselves, and their heirs, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with the said James B. Robbins Son -  
his heirs and assigns, that they the said Thomas A. Spence and Eleanor his  
wife and their heirs and all persons claiming under them, shall and will, from time to time, and at all times  
hereafter, at the reasonable request, cost and charge of the said James B. Robbins Son -  
his or any of his heirs or assigns, make and lawfully execute, acknowledge and deliver,  
all and every such further and other deed, conveyance and assurance in the law whatsoever, for the better and  
more fully conveying and assuring to the said James B. Robbins Son -  
his heirs and assigns, all the right, title, estate and interest at law and in equity, which  
the said Thomas A. Spence and Eleanor his wife - now have or can lawfully  
claim, in and to the said premises with the appertenances, herein before described and mentioned to be bargained and  
sold, according to the true intent and meaning of the parties to these presents, as by the said James B. Robbins  
Son - or by any of his heirs or assigns, or by  
his or - their counsel learned in the law, shall be reasonably devised or advised and required.
