Christian Science Churches and Reading Rooms

The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Massachusetts, and its branches in all countries constitute the Christian Science denomination or Church of Christ, Scientist. This denomination was founded by Mary Baker Eddy, at Boston, in 1879, as "a church designed to commemorate the word and works of our Master, which should reinstate primitive Christianity and its lost element of healing" (Church Manual, p. 17).

Selected lessons read from the Bible and "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" (the Christian Science textbook, by Mrs. Eddy) constitute the only sermons at the Sunday services held in The Mother Church and its branches.

Wednesday evening meetings are also held, which include testimonies of healing and experiences and remarks on Christian Science.

Each church maintains a free Reading Room where authorized Christian Science literature may be read or purchased. In connection with these Reading Rooms, many of the churches maintain free lending libraries from which authorized Christian Science literature may be borrowed.

The public is cordially invited to attend these services and visit these Reading Rooms.

The reader is expected in each case to continue to the end of the paragraph unless there is a dash followed by the number of the concluding line, which in some cases may be found on the next page. Read to the last period in a concluding line unless otherwise directed.

All the Bible references in a section should be read in their order before reading the Science and Health references in that section.

Golden Text: Romans 8:13. If ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live.

Responsive Reading: II Corinthians 5:1-6,
8-10, 17

1 We know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

2 For in this we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed upon with our house which is from heaven:

3 If so be that being clothed we shall not be found naked.

4 For we that are in this tabernacle do groan, being burdened: not for that we would be unclothed, but clothed upon, that mortality might be swallowed up of life.
