Beginning November 3, 1958, the public school children of Worcester County will have the new and interesting experience of receiving part of their daily instruction through television. This is being made possible through the cooperation of a number of school systems in a three-state area; namely: Caroline County, Maryland; Wicomico County, Maryland; Somerset County, Maryland; Worcester County, Maryland; Seaford, Delaware; and Accomack County, Virginia.

For the first year of operation of the educational television project, instruction will be offered in the fields of music (second and fourth grades) and science (fifth and sixth grades). Two lessons will be presented each day over Station WBOC-TV from 1:30 to 2:30 P. M. Parents are invited to tune in. The telecasting schedule will be as follows:

Mondays and Wednesdays, 1:30 P. M., Second Grade Music
Tuesdays and Thursdays, 1:30 P. M., Fourth Grade Music
Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, 2:00 P. M., Sixth Grade Science
Tuesdays and Thursdays, 2:00 P. M., Fifth Grade Science
Fridays, 1:30 P. M., Art, Story Hour, News
