Opening of Schools: Wednesday, September 5.

Maryland State Teachers' Association: Schools dismissed at noon on Friday.

Armistice Day: Sunday, November 11. Appropriate exercises should be held on Friday.

Thanksgiving Holidays: Thursday and Friday, November 22 and 23. Schools will re-open on Monday, November 26.

Christmas Holidays: Begin after the close of school on Friday, December 21. Schools re-open Wednesday, January 2.

Close of First Semester: Friday, January 18. All examinations should be completed by that date. Work of the second semester begins on Monday, January 21.

Lincoln's Birthday: Tuesday, February 12. Schools in session. Appropriate exercises should be held.

Washington's Birthday: Friday, February 22. Schools in session. Appropriate exercises should be held.

Maryland Day: Monday, March 25. Appropriate exercises should be held. Special attention to the settlement of Maryland should be given in the history classes preceding this date.

Easter Holidays: Begin after the close of school on Thursday afternoon, April 18. Schools re-open Tuesday morning, April 23.

Arbor Day: To be fixed by proclamation of the Governor. Schools in session. Appropriate exercises should be held and Clean-Up-Day observed.
