MEMORANDUM FROM THE OFFICE OF THE CHAMBER OF MINES AND OIL

In attempting to secure information in regard to mining or oil companies, the following is suggested:

CALIFORNIA.—Where companies are incorporated under the laws of California, write the State Corporation Commission, Sacramento, California, for information shown on their records concerning the company, particularly names and addresses of companies or individuals filing corporation returns. Then communicate direct with individuals mentioned.



ARIZONA.—Where companies are incorporated under the laws of Arizona, write Corporation Commission, Phoenix, Arizona, for information suggested above.

NEVADA.—Where companies are incorporated under the laws of Nevada, write Secretary of State, Carson City, Nevada; also State Bullion License and Tax Collector, Carson City, Nevada, for any information their records may disclose.

OTHER STATES.—Where companies are incorporated under the laws of any other state we suggest writing to the Secretary of State of the state in which the company is incorporated; also to the Secretary of State of the state in which the company is operating or presumed to be operating, for any information he may have on record, but ask particularly for the name and address of the individual filing the corporation returns, and then communicate with him.

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.—The Internal Revenue Bureau, Washington, D. C., receives annual returns from all existing corporations in the United States. This department will furnish only the name and address of the officer of the corporation filing the return.

Always send stamp for reply, except to Internal Revenue Bureau at Washington.
