at Bunker's. He could as well as he is com-
ing down on board the boat - and not injured
himself.

He has not supposed of
my property and therefore it is not my business
to assist you as spoken of. I feel certain
has advanced considerably, and the place
has improved much beyond my expectations.
Several fine substantial buildings have been
erected, much finer than I had seen in
