

MELANCHOLY ACCIDENT.—On Monday last, Master Willie F. Hastings, son of Mr. D. N. Hastings, of this city, about ten years of age, was thrown from a horse, and fractured his left arm. One of the bones below the elbow protruded from behind, and came out in front, through the fleshy part of the arm, tearing the arteries all to pieces, and causing the blood to flow in great profusion. Dr. Peabody, of this city, and Dr. Murray, from the Barracks, were in attendance, and replaced the pieces of the arm. On Wednesday, however, amputation was deemed necessary, and Dr. Murray accordingly performed the operation. Since that time, the child has been very weak, yet it is still hoped that he will recover.
