

PROTESTANT EPISCOPAL CHURCH.

Observance of the Seventh Anniversary of the Church Union.

The seventh anniversary of the Church Union of San Francisco, was observed at Trinity Church last evening. There was a large attendance, the evening services in the other Episcopal churches being generally omitted to allow their members to be present at the anniversary. Interesting addresses were delivered by the Rev. E. D. Spalding, Principal of the Trinity Day School, and the Rev. D. W. C. Fowell, of St. Peter's Church. Rev. Dr. Beers, of Trinity Church, who was to deliver an address, was unable, owing to ill health, to be present. The Right Rev. Bishop Kip, who was also expected to address the society, was unable to attend the meeting, having been called from town. His annual report as President of the Union was read by the Vice-President, Mr. Samuel Graves. It contained a full account of the working of the organization since its last anniversary. The society now has 185 members, forty-seven persons having withdrawn from it during the past year. The receipts amounted to \$789 25, and the disbursements to \$771 45, leaving a balance of \$17 80 in the treasury. There is also a deposit of \$211 to the credit of the Permanent Fund, and one of \$336 to the credit of the Committee on Reading Room, making the total available means \$564 80. The sum of \$195 has been expended for the sick, \$240 for the destitute, and \$240 for missionary work at the Alms-house.

The report concludes with an earnest appeal for more members and money to carry on the work of the society.
