

Dr. Hubbard was the leader of his profession in Connecticut, nor was the recognition of his ability confined to this state. Of thorough methods and a deep student, his knowledge was complete. He was free from the prejudices of the old school, and it was always his aim to make use of all the modern discoveries in medicine and surgery. He had a wide reputation as a medical expert in the courts, and his opinions were convincing with juries. Experienced lawyers have declared him to have been one of the best expert witnesses in the country.

Dr. Hubbard was the inventor of a great number of formulae which are almost universally used in drug stores. The patenting of any one formula would have earned him considerable wealth, but he refused to take out patents, preferring that humanity should benefit by his discoveries. Among the poor his name was synonymous with kindness and sympathy for the unfortunate. In instances almost without number he was known to defer a visit to a patient in comfortable circumstances to hurry to the bedside of one too poor to pay the fee for attendance.
