Evening Dec 28th1849

Dear Bro,

I have just learned of an opportunity of sending by Capt Von Pfister since putting my other letter in the P. Office. I send by him 465.75 in dust according to Joseph's weighing. I have not time to see to it but presume it is correct. By the express of Adams & Co please send to Mrs Buck two ounces of gold dust fine if you have it. Care of J. D. Pratt or by Malden if he will take it. She is anxious that she should get it as she has written about it. Please put in the package a little strip of paper ("For Mrs Buck from Mary") written on it. By my other letter you will see that I have sold the invoice of stoves to Hoyle & Winslow provided you have not previously bargained for them. By the way I have just discovered that I have not sent a copy the bill of sale by the other letter so I send it this. Hoyle wishes you to write him at Sac City immediately whether you have sold it or not if not to forward him a copy of invoice, and us to let him know of the arrival of vessel. In great haste pr letter.
