By virtue of his office, he was also Tax Collector and License Collector of Benicia, and had charge of a large amount of funds. A warrant in the hands of constable Baker, for his arrest, arrived here last evening, says the San Francisco Bulletin of yesterday, and the detectives, Lees, Johnson and Chapell, searched for him. They ascertained for certain that he left for Honolulu, on the bark Yaukee, which sailed on Monday. He is the man to whom Gov. Weller gave \$500 for a pretended arrest of Tipperary Bill; though, had our detectives not been engaged in that hunt, Bill would, beyond a doubt, have been depredating to this day.
