

**1849 09 21 Wetmore in Benicia to Gray**

Benicia Sept 21st 1849

Dear Brother

I received your letter last evening. Mr. Hall says Mr. Hanson promised that the Hebe should come up and bring McConkrys house without expense. Bales says nothing was said in regard to expense except in the case of some goods of his on board another vessel. If they were put on board Mr Hanson was to charge freight. Hall however says that the next day after he promised them to bring their house up that several men present you among those and Hanson said he should come up we fearing any additional expense he might be at and that you asked what it would probably be to which he replied some four or five hundred dollars probably. But when he was up here he told me that he would...*(end of page 1)*

...he would bring his house up on the Hebe by paying expenses etc to which we replied its of no use to talk that way to me you know what you promised me on board the Parker. He then said to never mind I made it all satisfactory or words to that effect. A gentleman will call on you in regard to that invoice of wines. He wants them for a hotel in Sac City. Bring the most if not all the oysters up unless you get a big vessel. I have not time to say more Stephens is off and I only this minute knew of his going.
