
Dear Martha:

I am green with envy at the wonderful museum that your group has created. You all deserve commendations for developing this project and seeing it through to completion.

My grandmother, Mary Emmert Stover, once lived in a small house where the sheriff's station now stands. My uncle, Dan Stover, also lived there while he went to La Verne College. My mother visited in 1933, then returned in 1935. She taught 8th grade and music in the San Dimas Elementary School from September, 1935, to May, 1936, then resigned to get married. A letter of Feb 8, 1936 was sent to her at 115 S. Cataract.

Here are a few items from her teaching career which seem appropriate in the archives of the San Dimas Historical Society. I also enclose several paragraphs about San Dimas and her teaching which I extracted from her autobiography.
