

The undersigned, Master of the frigate
Norice, have this day, the 22^d of September
1867, in the presence of two witnesses,
also undersigned, opened a box, made
of card-boards, and sealed by means
of red ribbons, with six seals bearing
the arms of Bishop of Vincennes, Dr.
Celestin de la Hailandiere, said to contain
the body of St. Severa, Virgin & Martyr.
We found that the seals were also
in good order and the body of said
Saint consisted, in quite a number of
bones; we particularly recognized a part
of the skull. All the bones that were
well preserved indicated, that the said
Saint must have suffered martyrdom
at quite a tender age. We likewise
saw a large amount of ashes mixed
among well preserved bones.

The box was then closed again and
sealed with the seal of the Master of the
