HOMES BUILT by PHILIP TRACY

Alfred F.Tracy(my Grandfather) of Gouldsboro. Maine, was said to have built the first house by using 2x4 studding instead of mortise and tenon. He also cut and framed what is now the Prospect Harbor Community Building, and many more buildings in the Gouldsboro area.

His son, Fred Tracy also became a carpenter, and built and finished many houses in the Town of Gouldsboro.

I, Philip Tracy, son of Fred Tracy, have been a carpenter all my life, some 60 years or so.

My son, Allen Tracy is a Structual Engineer in Connecticut, also in the building game, so guess it sort of runs in the family.

CROWHURST PUB

Mr. Crowhurst was the last owner of The Wayside Inn, West Gouldsboro. After the Inn burned in 1934, Phil built this building which Mr. Crowhurst ran as a pub until he was murdered here in 1938. The building is now a private home and is located across Route 1 from The Old Town House Museum.
