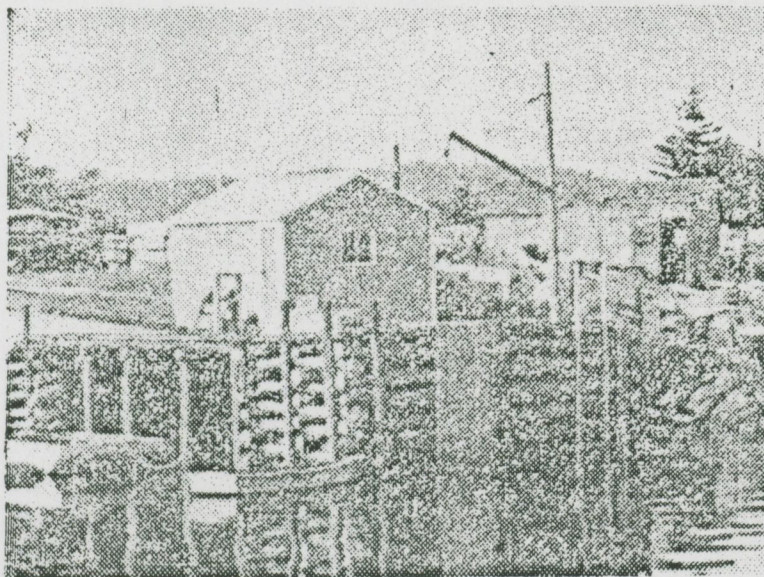

This is the new wharf and office Everett Colwell built for his growing lobster business. —Myrick Photo.

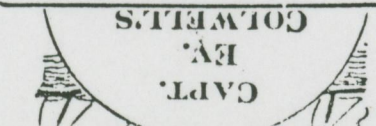
Everett Colwell, of South Gouldsboro Builds New Dock For Lobster Business

SOUTH GOULDSBORO — Lobster buyer, Everett Colwell, has completed a new wharf and office building to be used in connection with his business. His lobsters are bought from a float managed by Kenneth Hamilton, and the new building will be used as an office and storeroom, and a place where the boys can relax and talk things over. The wharf is 20x70 feet and the office 12x20 feet. Colwell sells gasoline, oil and rope, and some fishing supplies.

Colwell also buys lobsters in Otter Creek, and picks them up in a Dodge truck. His regular fishermen in Otter Creek are Shirley Bracy, Harold Walls, Chester Walls, Bernard Davis and Ansel Davis. This list does not include many fishermen who sell occasional hauls to Colwell. Some of his South Gouldsboro fishermen are Edwin Boyd, Fred Boyd, Fritz Bunker, William Briggs, George Potter, Holmes Briggs, Everett Potter, Homer Briggs, Lamont Stacey, Prescott Briggs, Mark Hammond and Arthur Hammond.

Colwell is co-partner with Malcolm McGregor in a weir which is located in Frenchmen's Bay. Before he entered the lobster business Colwell operated a sight-seeing boat at

business at Summer Harbor. He has also had considerable yachting experience, sailing out of Bar Harbor for a number of years. He sells his lobsters to the Maine Seafood Corp. of Rockport.

THE SIGHT-SEEING TRIP

The sight-seeing trip around
Frenchman's Bay is the most com-
plete ever given for \$1. It is a trip
that will forever live in your
memory, and a visit to this gar-
den-spot of Maine is not complete
without it. Color, grandeur, im-
mense cliffs, caves, islands of yel-
low borders—Nature in all her
glory; the rock-bound coast of
Maine.

Points of interest, such as Iron-
bound Isle Caves, Natural Bridge,
Long Porcupine Island, along the
shore of Bar Harbor passing many
magnificent summer homes of the
socially prominent families of
America, through to Hull's Cove,
beyond to Cadillac Mountain and
the adjacent ranges. This twenty-
mile trip includes many other
points of interest that will be
pointed out by the captain.

Parties may be left and called
for at Bar Harbor landing by re-
quest.
