



The Wayne and Bill Smith Story Wayne Smith was born on October 28, 1934 in Birch Harbor, the son of Dwinell and Lillian Norton Smith (both natives of Steuben).

Wayne attended Birch Harbor and Winter Harbor grammar schools and then Winter Harbor High School for two years before transferring to Sullivan High School. He then spent his senior year at Sumner High School, graduating in 1953. A talent on both the diamond and hardwood, Wayne transferred to Sullivan after his sophomore year due to rumors that Winter Harbor was considering discontinuing their baseball program. While at Sullivan, Wayne played under legendary


Coach Del Merrill and was part of the Sullivan squad to compete on the 'new' Bangor Auditorium floor in 1952 in a game versus the Beals Island Braves and one of their top players, Stan Beal. Wayne completed his secondary education at the just-opened Sum-



ner High School, graduating in 1953. His high school activities included four years of basketball (guard),

baseball (pitcher/3B) and band. Wayne served his fellow classmates as an officer during his freshman, sophomore and senior years and was vice-president of the student council for the Tigers.

From 1953 until 1956, Wayne served his country in the U.S. Marine Corps,



Wayne married Patty Parkin of Gouldsboro on August 7, 1955. They became the parents of three children: 'Billy' of Lamoine, Terri Ann Gray of Boynton Beach, FL and Daniel (deceased).

From 1956 until 1959, Wayne was employed as a mechanic for Bean & Conquest of Bangor.

From 1959 until 1981, Wayne held a number of positions with the State of Maine, Department of Marine Resources, Bureau of Marine Patrol. During his first sixteen years, he was a Marine Patrol Officer, making his residence in Milbridge (1966-75). Before they departed Milbridge, the Smith family purchased a parcel of land on the Back Bay Road.

In 1975, Wayne was promoted to investigator, moved to Warren, and worked an assignment that

After another promotion to Lieutenant, in 1976, Wayne reported directly to the Captain of the Bureau. In 1979, Wayne was promoted to Captain, a rank that held the title of Deputy Chief of the Marine Patrol. 



to the Commissioner of the Department of Marine Resources. His duties included directing some 44 uniformed officers and an office staff of four in completing their assignments.

Anticipating retirement, Wayne and Patty built a home in Milbridge in 1980. He retired in 1981 and relocated to Milbridge to take a position as Assistant to the President of Jasper Wyman & Son, a food processing company.

In 1985, Wayne accepted an offer from the Town of Milbridge to serve as a police officer. A year later, he was hired by the Union Trust Company, working from 1986 until 1995 in their collections department.

In his early days, he was an avid runner, completing his first marathon in Kennebunk at the age of 49. At age 50, Wayne journeyed to Washington, D.C. where he completed the Marine Corps Marathon. He has since completed several half-marathons, the last one being when he was 69. Wayne remains very active for age 80, walking and golfing. He estimates that during the course of the winter there are approximately 150 basketball games that he attends as a spectator (high school, grammar school and

Patty likes to join Wayne on many of his walks and watch golf, quilt, knit and read. They are proud of their four grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.




Barren View Golf Course in Jonesboro is a frequent stop for Wayne and Billy Smith. They are featured with Laura Bagley and Jim Golike.
