



A Landmark Moves a Little

The South Gouldsboro Post Office, a long-time fixture in the community, was jacked up and skidded about 100 feet to a new location on the adjoining property of Robert Gerrish last Saturday, May 24. The 16-foot-by-24-foot frame building has been at the side of Route 186 for

more than 40 years, first as a general store and post office and later as just a post office. As a general store, it was operated by Frank Gerrish, Robert's father, until his death in 1973. In its new location, the post office will remain under the administration of Postmaster Ina

Bennett. The move was accomplished by contractor Paul Sullivan with a crew of helpers and some heavy machin
