READ THIS NOTE CAREFULLY.

NOTE.—By Act of Congress approved July 8, 1870, these vouchers are furnished FREE OF EXPENSE TO THE PENSIONER, and all payments of pensions are required to be made thereon. One will be forwarded to every pensioner before the 4th day of March, June, September, and December of each year. On or after the 4th day of the months above mentioned, the pensioner, with his pension certificate, will go before a magistrate and sign and execute the oaths and sign the receipts. If the pensioner sign by mark, two witnesses thereto will be required. The executed voucher will then be returned by mail to the U. S. Pension Agent mentioned below, who, upon its receipt, will forward to the sworn address of the pensioner, given within, a check for the full amount of pension due.

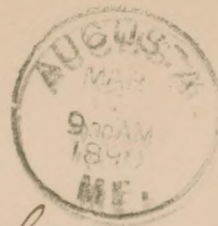
