Dear Louis:-

I am enclosing statement of last year's business resulting in the munificent sum of \$149.56 as profits for the year provided all of the accounts on the books are collectible.

In reference to the Wakefield account, if Mrs. Wakefield says anything more to you about it, I would tell her that you have sold or assigned the account to the collecting agency and have nothing more to do with it, and also give her the suggestion that they will probably sue for it and it will in any event cost her more to defend the case than it would to pay the bill for if she does not appear in court and defend the case, it will go against her by default. You might be called as a witness to testify to the fact that she acknowledged the account and agreed to pay it when she got her pension which I should say would be very good evidence if the collecting agency knows this.
