

Favorite Places by Tammis Coffin

What is your favorite part of the Sanctuary? For many, Shady Glade ranks high on the list. There you will find cool flowing waters, lush plant life, and violets blooming in spring. Two different types of skunk cabbage line the boardwalks. "It's a nice contrast to Hanging

Rock," says Lesley Muir of our staff. "I always recommend Shady Glade for hikers on their return. While in art school, Natasha Harrison, our Director of Development, created a sculpture of Shady Glade contained within a

suitcase. Open the lid, and you can see Shady Glade and hear the recorded sounds of flowing water. "Now, I can bring Shady Glade with me wherever I go," she laughs. Not that she is going far, because she works here now. Property Director, Joseph McLaughlin enjoys the lower field at the corner of Third Beach and Hanging Rock Roads, "for the views of the Sakonnet River

and the feeling that I get there." There's a nice breeze, and lots of wildlife, coyotes, deer, mink, skunk, northern harriers, "probably because not a lot of people go down there." Many hikers appreciate the ridge approaching Hanging Rock for its gnarled, ancient cedar trees, a fairly

unusual habitat for Rhode Island, and for all of New England for that matter. Our Naturalist, Lauren Miller recently spotted a special butterfly there. The Juniper Hairstreak is unmistakable for its bright green color and its affinity for eastern red cedar. The only

butterfly even vaguely similar was one Lauren had seen among mangroves in Florida. 
