

## **WILLIAM H. BIGGLESTONE**

MONTPELIER — William H. Bigglestone, 80, of 3 Dyer Ave., Montpelier, died Wednesday, Oct. 27, 1993, in Lee Memorial Health Park in Fort Myers, Fla.

He was born in Chelsea, Mass., March 29, 1913, the son of William and Lillian (Eekhoff) Bigglestone. He was educated in Melrose, Mass., schools and graduated from Melrose High in 1931 and Hebron Academy in Maine, and attended Boston University.

He was married in Montreal on June 20, 1936, to Nora Comber.
