

DEATH OF MRS. BAILEY. /

Mrs. Laura F. Bailey of whose death notice appeared in the Argus last evening was many years a resident of this city. She was the wife of the late Emery Bailey so many years conductor on the Central Vermont railway and later a mail clerk on the same line. Some 50 years ago with her husband she went to Boston to live and for the last few years she has spent the winters in Florida.

Following her custom of late years before coming back to Boston each spring she went to Pablo Beach for a little while and suffered a shock there dying from its effects.

The body was sent to Jacksonville, Fla., and is expected here tonight. She is the last of that branch of the Bailey family, her daughter having died a few years ago. While living here she was prominent in the work in Trinity church. She is survived by her sister, Mrs. D. S. Wheatley and a brother, J. W. F. Washburn of this city also a brother, J. C. Washburn of Waterbury. Although Mrs. Bailey was 80 years of age she traveled a great deal in the last years of her life and has been all over the United States during the last years of her life. The funeral takes place from the home of Mr. and Mrs. Wheatley at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon.
