

BOTTLING WORKS SOLD

The Misko Seal Beverage Co. has purchased from Edwin S. Meigs the Miller Bottling Works, taking immediate possession and will move all the equipment to the Wedge building on Berlin street. Mr. Meigs, the new proprietor of Miller's Inn, is to materially increase the capacity of the hotel and all space heretofore devoted to the bottling works is to be utilized for hotel purposes. The sale also will enable him to give his undivided attention to the hotel business.

James Twiss, who has charge of the Misko Seal plant, is familiar with the Miller business so that the sale amounts to a continuation of it as he has been practically in charge of it for the past ten years. The Miller machinery will be shipped away because the Misko company has all new automatic machinery. The bottles and cases, however, will be used since the company has had difficulty in securing the mon account of the freight embargo. A carload has been on the way a month and it is unknown when it will reach here. With this equipment the company will now be able to handle all business at once.
