

91ST BIRTHDAY.

Albert Johannott Believed to Be Oldest Bank Director in State.

Albert Johannott, first vice president of the Capital Savings Bank and Trust company, said to be the oldest bank director in the State of Vermont received many congratulations today on his attainment of his ninety-first birthday. He passed the day quietly at his home, 18 Loomis street, surrounded by his children, grand children and great grandchildren.

Among those who were here to visit him on this occasion were: his only daughter, Mrs. George Kellogg of Winchester, Mass.; Henry J. Kellogg and son, Henry Johannott Kellogg, Jr., of Turner's Falls, Mass., grandson and great grandson of Mr. Johannott, accompanied by Mrs. Henry Kellogg; and Miss Mary G. Kellogg of Winchester, Mass., a granddaughter.

Mr. Johannott, in spite of his ninety-one years, looks and acts as sprightly as most men at the age of sixty years. He wore a pink carnation in his buttonhole in honor of the occasion. He has always abstained from the use of intoxicating liquors and tobacco, and attributes his longevity in a large degree to temperance habits.

His health was of the best up to about two years ago when he suffered an attack of angina pectoris, and was laid up for a couple of months. Since then his hearing has been affected somewhat but he has been able to get about and transact business when necessary, as usual. Since the death of T. J. Deavitt, president of the Capital Savings Bank and Trust company, Mr. Johannott has been acting president up to the time of the recent election of A. J. Sibley as president. He is a director of the Wetmore and Morse Granite company and a trustee of Goddard Seminary. Since the sale of the Johannott and Hall furniture business about seven years ago, he has retired from active business.

Albert Johannott was born in Barre, January 18, 1826. He married Mary J. Parker of Barre, May 29, 1853. Two children, Arthur P. and Nellie J. Johannott, now Mrs. Henry Kellogg, were born to them. The death of Arthur P. Johannott, only son of Mr. Johannott, last year was a great blow to Mr. Johannott. Mrs. Johannott died August 11, 1882. He married again December 31, 1884, his second wife being Mrs. Rachel T. Chamberlain of Barre.
